The increasing trade between Great Britain and River Plate renders the new Customs Law issued by the Congress of the Argentin States a matter ot considerable interest to the merchants and shippers. In 1868 the exports to Great Britain from Argentine ports amounted to within a few pounds of one and a half millions sterling, while British imports for the same to have it reproduced, for Uruguayan period were close upon two millions. Hides and wool were, of course, the two stable articles of the former. though corn and cotton will probably ere long figure respectably in the list; whilst Great Britain returned cotton and woollen manufactures. With the exception of a small direct tax collected in the city of Buenos Ayres, the whole revenue of the National Goverament is raised by indirect taxation, more than nine-tenth's of which are Customs' duties, import and export, so that the revision of the tariff on a liberal basis speaks well for the soundness of the Argentine financiers. 
