

This New Year's day our thoughts are still fixed on Paris, but the season's discourse comes from Bordeaux, where Gambetta denounces, to 50,000 patriots that the Empire fell because it was an imposition, and lacked for bare truth and virtue. He expressed thoughts that breathe and words that burn-a belief that France will yet shake off her . invader, and become greater from the miseries and disasters she has passed through, and must

yet perhaps undergo. To-day is the one-hundredth and tenth of the siege of Paris, and it is only now the real crisis begins to surge. The darkness is thickeningthe circle of events narrowing in. The excitement is intensifying. How long will the brave citizens hold out-will the capital be bombarded-can the Moltke chain be broken-can the provinces come to the rescue? No other questions are ever thought of being put; it is a theme which no one ever becomes fatigued in ralking about -the oftener it turns up the fresher and more interesting it becomes. The most monstrous ' canards' are gravely discussed, though well known to be as idle as they are extravagant. Pant. ing time toils after the telegraph in vain for later, still later news. We battle in spirit, renew the mental combats, make imaginary peace treaties. tear them up, fight, argue, assert, and hope over again, impatient that the tragedy is prolonged, yet not wishing the curtain to fall on Paris, either in mourning or in grave-clothes. The ominous rumors are again com-

ing thickly that the position of the capital is sadder than an optimist could wish. It is not so much how long will Paris hold out as when she will surrender. The confidence is not so firm in the extent of her food resources;-it is felt the sorties can only swell the lists of death, and the besiegers' fire is considered 'tron.' Two sorties have failed, but have not cowed the inhabitants; the loss of Mont Avron grieved, but has not dispirited them, and they still hope against hope for armies of relief from the provinces.




