

to in a lease are binding on the heirs of landlord and tenant. The landlord cannot break a lease on the plea that he wants the house,

or whatever it may be, for his own use or for that of his family. If the contracting landlord sells the

bouse, or is forced to sell it; the sale in whatever form, or from whatever motive it may be, does not interfere with the lease; the tenant can retain possession until his lease expires. This rule applies to anything that can be leased as well as to a house. I will, however, continue making use of the word bouse to avoid the frequent repetition of other leaseable things. A tenant cannot make indecent use of the house he rents; if he does, his lease can be annulled. The term of a lease contract can-

not exceed ten years; any drawn up for a larger term expires at the end of the tenth year. All are linked together in one chain, and when once the chain gets entangled or may be said to depend essentially on the prosperity of the working classes. At the early part of the year just terminated, 1870, it was confidently predicted that we were entering upon a period of more rapid improvement, for the labourers of the country were being gradually absorbed into employment; and this feature continued and strengthened until the month of July when the war between France and Germany so unexstopped our advancing career. But to show the solid basis on which the trade of this country was founded, a fow weeks were sufficient to recover its previous tone and extent; and although the price of wool, Cotonial, is still Id. to 13d. per lb. lower than the early part of July and perhaps at least 2d lower than it might have been, still this results from what everybody can clearly un. derstand-the war; the war having vastly diminished the ordinary demand of the Continental manufacturers. 
