SANITARY MEASURES. MEETING AT THE GOVERNMENT HOUSE

So far back as last October, when the smell of the Riachvelo began to annoy the city, the Inspector of Saladeros. Mr. A. Walker, applied to the Provincial Government for an edict preventing the vessels in the Riachuelo from throwing 'basura' into the stream. At the same time the Municipality of South Barracas suggested to the Board of Health to fine any vessels for doing so, and oblige the police to burn the 'basura' of the ships, on the banks on either side of the Riachuelo. The

Inspectors should be named to go through the low class of lodging houses which are kept in so dirty a condition; also inspectors for the killing-grounds and city markets. We must observe that bad flour and unripe fruit are common. ly on sale; moreover, it is expedient to prohibit the Custom-house from selling by auction damaged provisions. which should be burnt. The Watersupply might be made much more beneficial to the city if the streets were watered twice a day, once about two hours after sunrise, again two hours before sundown. Special attention

Since writing the above we learn that it has been resolved by the Provincial Government to shut up all the saladeros on the 1st March. This will be very right and proper if the saladeros be definitively pulled down, but if they are allowed to resume working (as they did after the Cholera) then it would be as well not to stop them at all. Let us be told frankly that the interests of a dozen saladeristas are more valuable than the health of the city, and we shall either bow submissively to the decree--or, de-

vise a summary remedy. It is prohibited to sink wells and similiar constructions close to the division walls of houses. They must be a certain distance from the wall in accordance with the nature of the work, and subject to the restrictions of the Code.

The proprietor of ground adjoining a division wall can throw it down when it is absolutely necessary to be made more solid, but be must rebuild it without any unnecessary delay.

Trees must be three metres from the branches of trees project over another's grounds, they must be cut; and if the roots extend to the adjoining ground the injured person can cut them without the other's permission, even should the trees be planted at regulation distance.

The roofs of houses must be constructed so that the rain water may not fall into the adjoining ground.

Windows nor holes cannot be made of the adjoining proprietor. Windows may be opened in walls father.







(33 Vict., cap. 14, 33 and 34 Vic.,

The attention of British subjects, who have become naturalised in the Republics of the River Plate, is called to the 4th and 6th Clauses of the "Act to Amend the Law, relating to the legal condition of aliens and British subjects" (33 Vict., cap, 14, May 12th, 1870.), and which are as follows :-

HOW BRITI'H-BORN SUBJECT MAY CEASE TO BE SUCH:

Any person who by reason of his having been born within the dominions of Her Majesty is a natural-born subject, but who also at the time of his birth became under the law of any foreign of his birth became under the law of any foreign state a subject of such state, and is still such subject, may, if of full age and not under any disability, make a declaration of allenage in manner aforessid, and from and after the making of such declaration of allenage such person shall cease to be a British subject. Any person who is born out of her Majesty's dominions of a father being a British subject may, if of full age, and not under any disability, make a declaration of alienage in manner aforessid, and from and after the making of such said, and from and after the making of such declaration shall cease to be a British subject. EXPATRIATION.

(Capacity of British subject to renounce allegiance to Her Majesty.)

Any British subject, who has at any time before, or may at any time after the passing of this Act, when in any foreign state, and not under any disability, voluntarily become naturalised in such state, shall from and after the &c. are invested in mortgages on real estate and chattels, and the vouchers of same lodged in the the Government delegate, appointed to inspect the affairs of the Company. The Popular Argentina gives the following securities:—

1st. Administrative and guarantee capital \$f5:0,000, besides a reserve fund to be formed of \$f5:0,000, afterwards to be increased to \$f1:00,000.

2nd, Invertion of all the capital in documents time of his so having become naturalised in such foreign state, be deemed to have ceased to be a British subject, and be regarded as an alien,

1. That where any British subject has before the passing of this Act voluntarily become
naturalised in a foreign state, and yet is desirous of remaining a British subject, he may,
at any time within two years after the passing
of this Act, make a declaration that he is desirous of remaining a British subject, and upon


