

Those who first build in towns or suburbs in places not yet enclosed may construct the wall so that one half the width will occupy the adjoining ground, provided the entire width does not exceed eighteen inches.

Those who build enclosure walls in places where it is obligatory to do so, cannot claim half the value of these walls from the adjoining neighbours unless they make use of said division






