B. Ayres, April 30th, 1871. To General Don Bartolome Mitre. General and esteemed Friend.

Nothing is more natural than that all my attention should be attracted by the articles published on the National Finances, which are written by you as chief editor of the Nacion.

I know that the object of the law was to cancel those credits, in order to make available the additional duties destined to meet the foreign loan.

Before the epidemic broke out it became evident that this calculation was erroneous; but the error, which I call a generous one, arose from looking at one side of the question—the bright one.

Without losing a day, I did everything possible to remedy this state of things, without meeting with the slightest opposition in any way from the President of the Republic.

STATE OF MONTEVIDEO.

The last mails from Montevideo have brought fresh advice of the money crisis down here, which threatens to become still more dangerous if some measures are not promptly taken to afford relief.

What the National Government has proposed to that of the Province is not humiliating, as is asserted by the Nacion.

The delay consists in this. The Bank will lend the Government \$400,000 monthly, and the Government will continue to hand the Bank an equal sum, which is produced more or less by the additional duties and the ten per cent. of the ordinary revenue set aside to meet said law.

Such is the credit operation which I have proposed to the Provincial Government; and I hope that said Government, in its enlightenment, and through patriotic motives, as also the Chambers, and yourself, General, and all in their separate spheres of action, will support a proposal which is prejudicial to none, will prove profitable to the bank, and, under existing circumstances, has incalculable consequences.

THE ANTWERP MARKET.

Even situated as we are the last report of the Antwerp market cannot fail to interest a large portion of our readers. The export trade of the country, although at a dead lock, will be resumed with additional force when the crisis has past.

Imports February, 77,400, against 21,200 last year, 53,100 in 1869, and 25,500 in 1868.

Two cargoes of saladero hides last season's slaughter sold at auction as follows:—6300 Buenos Ayres ox per Voltiger at P.65 for the 15-20 k, 69 for 20-25 and 25-32 k, and 70 for the 25-28 k.

River Plate Saladero Beef Tallow—No sales of goods on spot. Quotation 100-2 pipes sold to arrive at #253. Stock 300-1 and 100-2 pipes.

River Plate Wool.—Private sales since 7th inst, 1200 bales River Plate and 1100 miscellaneous. Arrivals 4700 bales, including 600 bales from Havre and other European ports.

The auction which opened on 25th ult, and closed on 11th inst, gave the following results:—

All stocks are at a nominal quotation, the only business apparently doing being in gold, which commands a premium of 15 per cent. The last loan, called the 'Emprestito Platense,' which was at one time at a premium, is now without a quotation.

The Bolsas might as well remain what there is so little doing. Nothing doing in National securities or stock of any kind: even the speculation in gold is dying out.

LONDON LETTER.

I earnestly recommend to the notice of your readers the speech made by the Marquis of Salisbury the night before last on our joint and several guarantees in favor of Belgium, Turkey, Greece, and other small States destined to be eaten up by their neighbors.

Things don't look healthy in the Plate, and what with one drawback or other it is puzzling what to say that is encouraging. The prolongation of affairs in Entre Rios, the state of Montevideo, the yellow fever, in consequence of which it appears the Cordova Exhibition is again to be put off, present a bill of fare anything but tempting, and yet somehow there is faith in the destiny of the Argentine Republic, as evinced by the position of its funds, to say nothing of the many friends who have for so long upheld its cause under no slight disadvantages.

What a pity it is that the drop of Scotch blood should make Mr. Gladstone so clannish in his Government appointments and so timid from over-stuff of mind. If we could only stuff John Bright into him, what a splendid statesman we should have.

We have lately been told, with a certain show of authority, that a treaty was signed between Prussia and Russia at Ems immediately after the outbreak of the war, and that four corps of the Prussian army were kept in Silesia ready to co-operate with the Russians, should Austria declare for France.

The Prime Minister of the Lincoln administration Mr. Seward is now travelling in the East. It might be desirable that some of our Argentine Ministers should follow in the steps of the great North American diplomatist.

The Herald gives the following:—"Mr. Seward continues his Eastern journey with much dignity and success. The account of his visit to Pekin, and the diplomatic fashion of his intercourse with Prince Kung and other notables of the 'Flowery Land,' as furnished by our special correspondent, is interesting and suggestive.

Our New York colleagues discussing the cotton question give the following, which may interest some of our dry goods readers.

Now this American business has in the eyes of alarmists a peculiar significance as part of the grand conspiracy against England. They insist on believing that the understanding between the Emperors of Germany is, as an Austrian paper has just announced, a serious alliance, and that when M. Bismarck made friendly overtures to Austria at a time when the German armies in France were not so secure as they might have been, it was a piece

of thinking similar to what he has tried so successfully with poor dear Mr. Gladstone and his noble chum Lord Granville. They think that the Yankees are deceiving us in the same way, and that, as Russia and Germany combined can do nothing against England, the Americans will join them and take Canada, &c.

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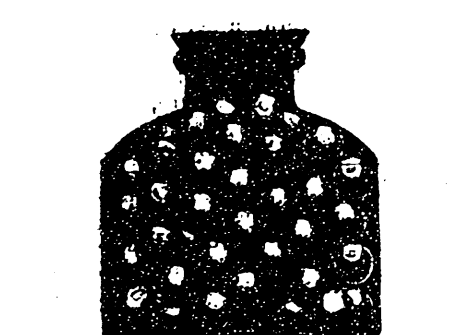

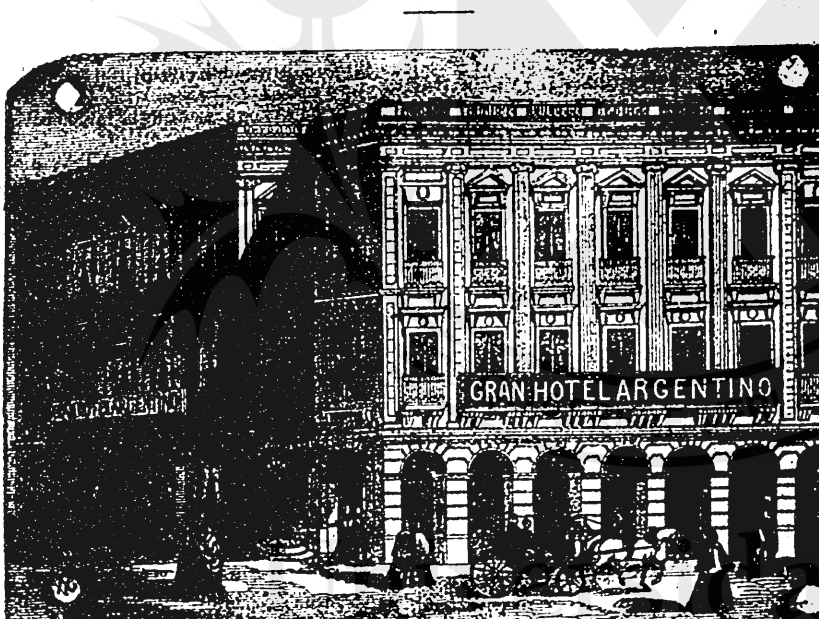
