NEW RAILWAY TO LOBOS. INAUGURATION TO PUBLIC TRAFFIC. On Wednesday, 24th inst. this new branch line of the Western Railway was opened to the public, without any official inauguration, owing to the universal mounting caused by the recent epidemic. The length of the new line is 42 miles (68 kilometers), and the total distance from the Parque terminus to Lobos 103 kilometers. The first section which was opened to traffic last Christmas was from Merlo to Marcos Paz (121 miles); there are two other immediate stations, Las Heras and Zapiela, before reaching Lobos. The total cost of the new line is stated in round numbers at £200,000, or almost £5,000 a mile, being the cheapest iron, and at one period the men were able to lay down two miles a week. 


