For instance, suppose in a part of the river where the east shore is rock, the land be tilted upwards from the west, then the river not being able to fall away eastwards must cut away the uplifted soil of its west bank until it makes room or itself at its former level.

Irregularities in the upheaval might also in places cause it to sway at times against its left bank without any insurmountable obstruction appearing immediately opposite. The abrasiou now going on between Rosario and San Lorenzo appears to me, judging from the inclination and general appearance of the ravines cut by the rain-water as it runs off the land, to have commenced somewhat recently. Its immediate cause may, perhaps, be traced to the accidental formation of some obstruction in the river; but I think it more likely that it results from an irregularity in the upheaval of the land. If the requisite information can be obtained, it may perhaps be found that the date of the commencement of this abrasion immediately follows the occurrence of au earthquake in Chile. 


