THE COMMERCIAL CASINO

The most amusing news from Montevideo is that the merchants in that city are about to club together to form a "mercantile casino."

THE GREAT STRIKE OF ENGINEERS

The great strike of engineers in Newcastle and Gateshead looks worse to-night, Mr. Stephenson, who represents the largest works in Newcastle, has also declared against the nine hours' movement in a letter received to-day. He says competition in the engineering trade has become so great, both from the Continent and Scotland, that if the Tyneside masters were to agree to the present demand, the workmen themselves would shortly be the sufferers.

THE ITALIAN MINISTER AT MONTEVIDEO

The Italian Minister at Montevideo is about to send in to President Balle's Government claims for damages and loss suffered by his countrymen through the war of the Rosas now going on in Banda Oriental.

The economy of credit has long been a fertile topic of investigation in the Mount. Everyone in Montevideo aims to benefit the whole by affording his experience and observation; nevertheless, errors have crept into even the best digested customs, and it is just as hard to drive a trade in any one branch in Montevideo as it is in Buenos Ayres; nay, more, it is often harder to collect a bill down there than here.

Customs digested with skill, countenanced by experience, and applauded by the 'introducers,' have been observed, buoyant for a time, on the breath of a purely easy market, and then suddenly obscured by some more plausible scheme to enable debtors to make both ends meet. But such is, we suppose, the necessary consequence where progress is brought in by the 'arcanum' of credit.

bring new facts into view; creditors become in nothing wiser by the trials and vicissitudes of their debtors. How often do they not make the point at which they originally closed an account a new starting point for a fresh venture, and thus continue the progress of sale and liquidation until they discover nominal gains far beyond the estimates which in the opening of their commercial career they regarded as the limit of a business credit—the 'ultima thule of trade.' The stream of credit as it flows onward flows with a very deepening channel in the Mount, and the new Casino mayhap will prove a lock to hold the current for a while until the river throws up from its bed some particles of that precious metal, some undiscovered ore which in the convivial hours of business at the Casino may be hooked by those who well know how to throw out the bait.

If the Casino commercial scheme is to succeed, then who can gain say that the best guarantee for success in trade in Montevideo is a heated judgment, an impatient investigation, and a muddled brain? As we have already observed we have yet to see the programme of this Commercial Casino, but we look with suspicion on the new club, and the more so since a Montevidean friend has sent us an amusing sketch of the formalities to be observed on enrolling a member, and the Latin oath which each member takes. These interesting details, until further advised, we hold for publication.

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
