THE MONTEVIDEAN WATER-WORKS.

The greatest enterprise in the River Plate is the Montevidean Water-Works. The mighty combination of genius and capital is nowhere more obvious than in these works...

The supply of water has been to the present dependent upon house cisterns, commonly called 'aljibes' and public wells in the outskirts of the city. In the summer season much inconvenience was experienced by the cisterns and wells running dry...

The works consist of—A large engine house, Boiler house, Three Gothic cottages. Machine shop, Smith's forge, Carpenter's shop, Peons' sheds, out-houses, stabling, &c.

The engine house is a stately pile, built to accommodate four powerful engines, three of which are at present up, and the foundations for the fourth are placed. The house is built of red sandstone, quarried on the site of the works...

The concessionaires at once set to work; Mr. Salustiano Puente was sent to England as their agent. Mr. Edward Woods of London, one of the first engineers of the day, was appointed as consulting engineer in England...

The following are the names of the gentlemen who compose the staff of the Montevidean Waterworks:—Concessionaires—Ambrosio P. Lezica, Anacbaris Lanus, Henry Fynn.

Consulting Engineer—Edward Woods, London. Chief Engineer—Frederick Newman. Secretary—Adolphus Gubarret.

Mechanical Engineer—Albert Keyser. Assistant Engineers—John Fynn, Henry Yurgensen. Contractor—R. R. Pealer.

Freight Contractor—Albert Butler. Builder—O. Abello y Llano. General Assistant—John Iliffe. General Agent, London—Salustiano Puente.

If we except the Liebig Extract cylinder has a capacity of about four times that of the high pressure. The pistons of these cylinders are with parallel motion, and applied to one end of the working beam...

In the boiler room there are seven large boilers each 28 feet long, 6 feet in diameter, with internal flues 3 feet 6 in. diameter; on each boiler there is a steam chest or dome 5 feet high and 3 feet in diameter, the working pressure, we were told, is 40 lb. per square inch above atmosphere...

The pumps are also an important feature. There is a pump to each engine, they are of the bucket and plunger kind, and worked by direct action from the beam; each pump delivers 1100 gallons of water per minute into the rising main...

As we leave the engine house we see the grand main pipe which passes under the flight of steps that leads to the portico, and travelling over hill and dale carries the water into the reservoir at Las Piedras...

The reservoir at Las Piedras is another master work that calls for notice. It is cut out of the solid rock, and on an elevation which is higher than the Liberty column in the Plaza Cagahuca in Montevideo...

Beneath this is a smaller slab for the date 1871. The great height of the engine house is accounted for to accommodate a Goliath or travelling crane which runs along the whole building, and which is used to elevate the ponderous pieces of machinery...

The engines, pumps, boiler-house, &c., form a little world of their own; it would require the pen of an experienced hydraulic engineer to describe them. Mr. Newman, the chief engineer, guided us through the maze of machinery, &c., explaining everything...

The engines consist of three double-cylinder, condensing rotative, steam engines, with pump, boiler, &c. One of these powerful engines was at work as we inspected the premises, pumping the Santa Lucia water from wells beneath the engine-house...

Attached to the reservoir is an 18 inch drain, and also two 18 inch draw off sluices. Around the embankment of the reservoirs are dwarf walls, which are built entirely around. The internal slopes of the reservoirs are pitched or paved with stone laid solid in mortar...

The following description will apply to each of the three engines: The high pressure cylinder has a capacity of about 25 cubic feet (piston displacement), and the low pressure cylinder has a capacity of about 40 cubic feet (piston displacement).

under the river, and making an aqueduct extending 180 metres from the bed of the river to the engine house; this aqueduct is 4 feet 6 inches high, and 3 feet 6 inches wide, lined with concrete, the arches made of radiated brick made specially on the establishment...

The dimensions of the engine house are 90 feet long by 32 feet wide, and the depth from floor to bottom of the pump wells is 47 feet 6 inches. The four wells are 7 feet in diameter each, and are lined with concrete; in fact, native concrete has been employed wherever practicable...

The nominal horse power of the engines is 145, and they cost, we believe, from £16,000 to £17,000 each in England. The average cost of the pipes, we understand, is £5 per ton. To complete the arrangements of this immense establishment the concessionaires brought out from England their own iron lighters, and also a small steamer, the Sol, to tow the lighters up the river...

The water of the Santa Lucia, as we have already mentioned, is so clear and crystal that it requires no filtration, but we understand that Mr. Newman contemplates making filters, which can be constructed at a very slight outlay, to be used if necessary. The one engine at work when we visited the works is able to supply Montevideo with 1 1/2 million of gallons of water daily...

The materials for supplying the houses of the city are some on hand, and more on the way out; already the workmen are engaged putting the water into 50 houses, and it is estimated that there are at least 5,000 houses in Montevideo that must of necessity get the water supply. In the Matriz Plaza there is a majestic fountain of Carrara marble, which is really an ornament to the city...

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forget Buenos Ayres 'in toto', and look up the waterworks which supply such cities as London, Paris and Dublin; or cross the Atlantic and study perhaps the greatest waterworks of the day, the Croton Works of New York. We are free to confess that the magnitude of these Santa Lucia Waterworks took us quite aback; we were unprepared for works of such dimensions, and Montevideo may well feel proud of the achievement of Lezica Lanus & Fynn.

Londoners were recently rather astonished by a proposal to buy up the eight water companies at present supplying their city, and bring one vast water supply to the capital of the world from the valleys in Wales. Yet when we take into account the relative population, trade and commerce of the two cities, London and Montevideo, we must say that the scheme which Messrs. Lezica, Lanus, and Fynn have so successfully carried out is every way greater.

Whoever travels over the great extent of country that lies between Montevideo and San Lucia will realize the difficulties attending this colossal enterprise. The country is not a flat like Buenos Ayres, but undulating and broken; but the superior engineering skill of Mr. Newman overcame every difficulty; and with picturesque felicity, Mr. Newman in the inauguration day of the works, at the English Club-house in Montevideo, called for those parties who boasted they would drink all the Santa Lucia water that he could ever pump into the city of Montevideo, to come forward and fulfill their promise.

Few Orientals believed that the works would ever be carried out; none thought it possible in this generation; yet science, and capital, and energy have prevailed. The Waterworks of Montevideo are a solemn fact, teaching us lessons by which we unfortunately in Buenos Ayres should profit. The same men, the same capital, the same skill are at hand, to bring to us the waters—not from the Gas-house, or the Olivos, or San Isidro, but from the Boca de las Palmas of the Paraná, will we avail of it? We doubt it. The elements which produce such works in a country even torn and destroyed by civil war, are neutralized here by the poisonous vapors of political, social, Municipal, and administrative mismanagement. Moses himself, if he lived, would fail to strike water from the shattered emblems of a plague-stricken republic.

THE FRENCH MAILS. IMPORTANT FROM EUROPE. Lisbon, June 27th. Telegrams yesterday from Madrid announce a ministerial crisis: King Amadeus refused to receive the resignation of Marshal Serrano and the other Ministers. The Cortes have suspended their sittings till a new Ministry be formed. The Emperor and Empress of Brazil arrived at Madrid on the 24th.

The new French loan, it is predicted, will be favorably received. Postal and telegraph communication through France is restored. The Count of Paris is expected. The Duc d'Aumale landed at Calais on the 25th. The telegram published in some English papers about a detention of French prisoners in Germany is void of foundation: Arrests in Paris continue, also the state of siege. The new French loan was emitted at 82 1/2 and is already at 1 per cent prem. Baron Haussmann is one of the new Paris candidates. The city is quite healthy, after the heavy rains. The Journal de Paris says it is proposed by many to raise the Prince Imperial to the throne. The work of restoring the public buildings has been begun; most of the effects stolen from the churches have been recovered; Karl Marx, the first projector of Communism, has been seized in Holland.

The Emperor of Germany leaves Berlin for Hanover on the 30th to assist at the triumphal entry of the Hannoverian and Brunswick corps d'armee. The Belgian Government has called out all the Garde Civile. The Pappal Nuncio at Brussels states that the Pope will at once leave Rome and take refuge in Corsica if Victor Emmanuel enters that city with his Government on July 1st as announced. The anniversary of the Pope's accession was celebrated at Brussels with illuminations, but the liberal party caused some disturbances, and the police had to interfere. Queen Victoria sent a message to Pius IX. on his 25th anniversary, for which the Pope expressed his profound satisfaction. The English deputation presented His Holiness with £3,000; a large portion of it was at once given for distribution among the poor of Rome. Thousands of travellers from every country went to the Vatican on June 21st to present their compliments to the Pope.

The new Turkish loan for £3,700,000 was concluded at Constantinople between the Sublime Porte and Mr. Edwards. Ali Pacha, is sick. The Chambers at Gran Cairo were opened by the Khedive of Egypt on the 16th, a flattering speech. At Belgrade an attempt was made on June 12th to assassinate Prince Milan, but the bomb-shell exploded harmlessly. It is thought the attempt was meant merely as a hint to the Prince. Advices from China repeat the alarm given by the Celestial Government against all Western Railway Stations than the waterworks for such a city as Buenos Ayres. 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On the 1st of April a dreadful earthquake occurred at Bechang; it lasted 11 days, destroying the country for 40 miles; 2283 lives lost. The Governor General of Canada intends to ratify the Alabama Treaty without consulting the Canadian Parliament, which fiercely opposes it. In the West Indies a French privateer called the Palestro has been observed. The cable from St. Kitts to St. Thomas was safely laid down. Sugar is still rising.

The English House of Commons has appointed a committee to examine into the railroad communication between the Mediterranean and the Gulf of Persia. The proposed line by the Euphrates Valley will shorten the route to India by 1,000 miles or 7 days journey, and save England £50,000 a year. The Census of Great Britain and Ireland shows 31 1/2 millions, of which Ireland has only 5 1/2 millions. In 1841 Ireland stood for one-third of the U.K. Kingdom; to-day it is only one sixth. London June 20th.

The Echo du Nord says that the Commission considering the reorganization of the French army has decided upon an active force of 360,000 men, and a reserve of 900,000. Some opinions were expressed in favor of a higher figure, but none in favour of a lower. Advices from Madrid report most favourably on the prospects of the harvest in Spain. During 1871 it is believed the country will be able to make shipments to the value of £10,000,000 or £12,000,000. Great expectations, it is said, are also entertained as to the wine and oil crops this year.

The Grand Duke Wladimir of Russia yesterday visited Messrs. Pardey's gun manufactory in Oxford, street, and afterwards the Exhibition of Water Colours in Pall-mall. The Grand Duke subsequently went to Bridgewater House, and spent some time in going over the picture galleries containing the well-known Bridgewater collection, and to the Royal Academy of Arts Exhibition at Burlington House. The Financier says:—"Quotations have advanced to some extent since the beginning of the year; a number of new loans and projects of various kinds have been brought out, and many more are expected. Nearly the same could have been said at this time last year, but things had gone further than they have now; that is to say more speculation was going on, and prices, in many cases, were higher than they are now. For example, Consols were 1 per cent higher; and foreign bonds, with the exception of the South American Stocks and Spanish, were in nearly every case higher than they are at present. English Railway Stocks, on the other hand, are nearly all quoted better now than they were then, the principal exception being that of the Midland Company. The present probability appears to be that, with some exceptions, and with the usual reactions of times, prices will experience a considerable rise, on balance, by the end of the year, apart from political accidents."

In the Probate Court this morning, in the case of Lynch v. the Government or Republic of Paraguay, Lord Penzance gave judgment. The case came before the court in the shape of a demurrer, and raised the question whether or not the estate of Francisco Solano Lopez, late-President of the Republic of Paraguay, should be distributed according to the law of Paraguay in force at the time of the decease, or subsequently; in other words, whether a decree made subsequently, confiscating all his property to the Paraguayan Government, was to have the effect of vesting in them the property which was left at his death which was in this country. Lord Penzance, in an elaborate judgment, allowed the demurrer, and thereby refused to act upon the decree of confiscation. On the application of Dr. Pritchard, costs were allowed.

A mixed committee of Protestant and Roman Catholic gentlemen has been formed in Ireland, for the purpose of purchasing from the Irish Church commissioners, and securing from further decay, the well-known "Rock of Cashel," with the ultimate view of restoring the now roofless Cathedral of St. Patrick's for public worship, and preserving King Cormac's Chapel. No particulars respecting the census returns can be obtained in Dublin; but it is said that they show the population of Ireland to be about five millions four hundred and eight thousand. The four provinces share in the decrease, Ulster least of all. All religious denominations have decreased. The Roman Catholics, who have most largely emigrated, show the greater proportion of the decrease. The Presbyterians come next. The decrease of the Episcopalian is small. The total decrease is nearly four hundred thousand.

A telegram from the Daily News correspondent in Berlin states that complications with France appear to be apprehended. It is even reported that orders have been given to stop the return from France of the German troops and the surrender of the rest of the French prisoners. The general rehearsal by the Philharmonic Society for the concert in favour of the poor and orphans takes place to-night, at 7 o'clock precisely, at the Coliseum.

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EDITOR'S TABLE.

The excursionists to Montevideo on the occasion of the inauguration of the Water Works returned on Sunday morning in the Republica. This splendid river steamer had to contend with a full gale of wind the whole way across, but weathered it bravely, the passengers scarcely feeling the severity of the weather. We give in another column a full and interesting description of the buildings, plant &c., of the Water Works in the sister city; there is nothing of the kind to compare with them in South America.

Governor Castro has refused to entertain the petition of Messrs Arana & Soler, of Barracas, that their saladero should be allowed to resume working on condition of their exporting the tallow in its raw state, and allowing Sr. Paiguari to render the 'agua de cola' innocuous, by the system of which the public have heard so much for the last year. The Council of Health has given public confidence in its rather rude shock, by the offhand way in which it recommended the Executive to permit what it (the Council) denounced six months ago; for it must be remembered that Sr. Paiguari's system of dealing with saladero refuse has yet to be proved effective on a large scale. We think the Governor of the province has acted wisely and well in refusing to make any exceptions till the saladeros question be permanently settled by the Chambers.

An invasion of 3,000 Chilian Indians is announced from Azul. Colonel Borges, at the head of 300 friendly Indians and a regiment of National Infantry, had marched to La Blanca to give them battle.

The *Progreso* considers that the removal of the capital to any other city of the Republic will have an adverse effect on the national credit abroad, and that in no other place can so many facilities for carrying on the federal government be found. Our colleague considers it advisable to maintain the *status quo* for the present. The total losses in killed, wounded, and missing of the German armies during the late war are set down officially at 116,028, of which 94,453 for Prussia and North Germany, 12,461 for Bavaria, 2,411 for Wurtemberg, 3,418 for Baden, and 2,255 for Hesse. The artillery comprised 2,500 pieces; the infantry and cavalry used 150 million cartridges; and the total cost to Germany has been only 43 millions sterling.

Mr. George P. Crauford leaves this morning for Corioba, 'en route' to Rioja, on a visit to the celebrated Famatina mines; he has promised us a full description of the state of the mining industry in that distant province.

Mr. Cadmus, the well known American barruero, left yesterday on a short trip to Europe; we wish him a pleasant voyage and speedy return.

Mr. Pafacios' weaving factory on the Rio de las Piedras, Salta, is now finished, and will commence work in a short time. The machinery cost \$3,000 in London, and the workmen are mostly Britishers.

The France arrived in port yesterday from Marseilles direct with 50 immigrants; and the Amazonas also brought a fair number. The emigration from France is increasing steadily to all parts of the world in consequence of the demoralized state of that country, and the River Plate must have its share.

Carme, the great billiard player, played a 'carambola' game of 500 with Mr. Molina on Sunday before a large concourse of amateurs, giving the odds Mr. Carme ran away from his adversary, finishing with a brilliant score of 101, whilst his opponent had only made 67.

The Don Ricardo has arrived with a cargo of rails for the Rio Cuarto Railway, she has sailed for Rosario to discharge.

A number of 'chevaliers d'industrie' finding business slack in town have taken to the high roads in the vicinity of the city, and nightly demands for 'money or life' are made by them; the Boca road is at present their favorite resort. An Italian sailor was robbed and nearly murdered in that thoroughfare early on Saturday night.

We understand that the recent festivities at Montevideo called forth an immense amount of inventive talent in the concoction of exciting potables. The greatest success achieved in this way is that of a gentleman, whose name we are not at liberty to publish; it is called the 'dry-hide watered cocktail,' and is a delicious compound that cheers, but never induces inebriation. Some of the excursionists profess to be in possession of the receipt for making this delicious drink. It will be seen by the European news, per French mail, that Lord Pezance, in the case of Lynch v. Paraguay, has allowed the demurrer raised to the plea that President Lopez's property had been confiscated by the new government of Paraguay. The Tichburne case still drags along, and it will probably have to be postponed till next session, as there are still 117 witnesses to be examined for the claimant. At one sitting of the court, Mr. Radcliffe, who appears slightly uneasy at the imputation Sir Roger states was, apparently most reluctantly obliged to cast on his wife, created a scene in court by making a statement to the effect, that 'he was an injured party.' The court was unfeeling enough not to be moved by this truism, and joined the counsel on both sides in 'suppressing' Mr. R. till the proper time for hearing him or his lawyer arrives. Councillor Magalhães, the new Bra-

zilian Minister to this Republic, arrived here on Sunday from Montevideo in the America. We salute the new envoy, whose brilliant antecedents augur the happiest continuation of the friendly relations existing between this country and the great empire he represents. H. E. is in common with all his fellow passengers had to come on shore in a cut, as the pampero had blown the beach dry near shore.

The Billingham Tramway Co. ran their cars yesterday for the first time up to the Almagro railway station. President Sarmiento has addressed a short message to Congress, pointing out that in consequence of the delays in inaugurating the Cordova Exhibition some more money will be necessary to keep that national enterprise alive, but H. E. states that the sum now required will not be lost to the Treasury, as when the Exhibition is over the sale of materials, &c., will cover it.

ON 'CHANGE.

The Bond market fell off to-day, owing to heavy sales made for account of the Bienhechores del Plata, in fact, all the sales to-day were for account of that Company. The following were the cash sales: 2900 Bonds at 65 1/2, 2400 " " 65 1/2, 6500 " " 65 1/2, 40,000 " " 65 1/2, 20,000 " " 65 1/2.

This was the extent of the Bond business to-day. Some two or three well-known speculators are watching the market, and it is thought probable that before the week is out a very large business in Bonds will be transacted. The great uncertainty which seems to exist in certain circles as to the arrival of gold by the next English mail checks the spirit of the bulls. In the Comodidad Office specie is expected by the next mail, but the questions touching the partial or whole negotiation of the Varela loan will soon all be cleared up, as the Finance Minister has been summoned to the House to give full explanations. There is much enquiry as to the extent of the Bond sales by the Bienhechores, but as yet not even the Manager or Directors of this financially prosperous company can say. The liquidation this year on the books of the company is certainly heavy, but fully three-quarters of the policy holders have already elected to go on for another five years.

The attitude of the exchange market is significant, the rate has dropped to 49 1/2 to 49, but bills are passed to 1-1/4 with a short credit. Our stocks of produce are rapidly diminishing; nearly everything is bought up, and exchange has been still more affected by two changes which bankers sweeping the market, having taken all the commercial paper offering at good rates. There was a decidedly improved attendance on 'Change to-day, the merchants and others whose absence was so much felt last week were on 'Change to-day, having returned in the Republic on Sunday morning.

It was stated on 'Change to-day that some very large and important paving contracts for the National Tramway have been entered into. The Engineer is expected by every steamer. Money rules very cheap and bills were discounted to-day at 6 1/2 to 8. Money was offered on bonds at 8 to 8 1/2.

There is much enquiry by speculators and others as to where the celebrated Abyssinian pumps sent out to the Plate by Sr. Balcarce, can be seen or had.

In Argentine Bank shares one sale to-day 29 sold at 10 prom.

French exchange was done to-day at 5.25 to 5.28 on Antwerp and Havre.

30 Central Argentine Railway shares were offered at 3 percent discount, but not sold. The news for produce per Amazonas is very encouraging. Great demand for hides and wool at advanced prices. River Plate produce everywhere in demand.

Bank of England interest has fallen to 2 1/2. Money is very abundant in all the European markets. The French Government has established an agency in London to put the 'cambios' on the new loan, the exchange of which is to be on the fixed calculation of 25 francs to 30 centimes per £1.

Messrs. Knowles and Foster, June 21st, publish the following: '1091 Buenos Ayres ox hides, middling, at 6 1/2. Stock, 4,010. There is a demand for cargoes to arrive. Sales of Rio Grande hides at 6 1/2 upwards. Market firm.

Tallow has been firm for the fortnight, and Russian continues at 4 1/2 to 4 3/4. Good demand for River Plate tallow, but none offering in the market. Holders ask high prices. Beef tallow is worth 43 to 43 1/2, and mutton tallow 42 1/2 to 43 1/2.

The Havre market reports are: 'R. Plate dry hides, no arrivals: 445 ox at 124 francs. Stock, 3,837 hides. 'Da. salted, 1423 sold, also 500 from Antwerp. 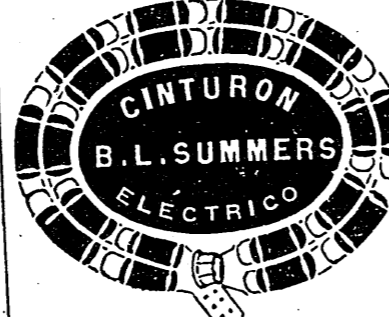

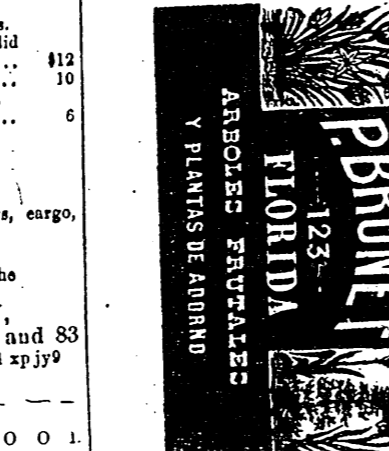
