FOREIGN CLAIMS. In the article on this subject, which appeared in our issue of the 11th inst. we endeavoured to show, without entering into the legal merits of the question, how short-sighted and fatal was the policy of the Argentine Government in repudiating the claims of foreigners for indemnification for losses sustained in the late rebellion in

Entre Rios. The Argentine Government cannot be blind to the fact, that the future prosperity of this country is wholly dependent on immigration for the development of its immense natural resources; and they must be blind, indeed, if they cannot see that the announcement they published to the world of their inability to protect foreigners in the possession of their property, and their determination not to indemnify them in the event of damage, destruction, or spoliation, in the not unfrequent political disturbances which afflict this country, will bave the effect of materially diminishing the tide of immigration, and will entirely stop the influx of that better class of emigrants, those who may

bave something to lose. In our second article, which appeared in our issue of the 12th inst., we endeavoured to show that the position taken by Dr. Tejedor, (and sustained by H. E. the President in his message), was utterly untenable, and that the whole of Sr. Tejedor's arguments were founded upon false deductions from an admitted principle.

The cases cited by Dr. Tejedor in his letter of the 13th ult., addressed to H.B.M. Chargé d'Affaires in support of his extraordinary resolve, are sently show, and the foundation of sand upon which he erects his superstructure of repudiation is contained in the two following paragraphs of his letter:---

"The Government does not consider tsolf responsible for damages by the rebels, the latter never having been Argentine authorities within the prescriptions of the Constitution. The Govarnment has never been obliged either by Treaty or International Law to protect the properties of foreigners within an enemy's country against such enemy. The special protection that every Government owes both to its own citizens and foreign residents ceases when such people are within the territory held by rebels, and from the moment that the power and jurisdiction of the National Government are over-
