Governor Castro published yesterday several valuable letters and instructions sent him by Mr. George Drabble of London.

1st. The ravages of the plague were due to the abominable condition of the city.

2nd. Buenos Ayres is at any moment exposed to a return of the epidemic, until sanitary improvements are effected.

3rd. The first and most necessary reforms, to close all the old water-closets, pools and wells.

4th. The drainage and water-supply are imperatively called for.

5th. Removal and burning of the basura needs an entirely new system.

6th. The use of lime, carbolic acid, and other disinfectants is much recommended.

7th. The Government of Buenos Ayres, in acknowledging these documents, thanks Mr. Drabble in the most cordial manner.

8th. Your Excellency will have already learned of the influential meeting in this city to sympathize with Buenos Ayres.

9th. As chairman of the committee I have been requested to forward you a copy of the resolutions.

10th. I wrote Your Excellency by last mail and have now the pleasure to congratulate you on the decline of the epidemic.

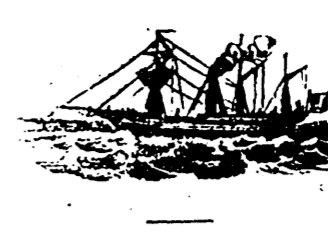
