



In view of so great a deficit the Government may adopt one of two courses, either reduce the expenditure or increase the taxes. A temporary expedient might be devised by using our credit, and this the Government thinks most advisable. No reduction can be made in the expenditure without injury to public interests, many of which are even at present indifferently attended to. We have neither customhouses, stores nor public offices in most of the Provinces; our ways of communication are incomplete; public instruction is far from being up to the mark; the army is in need of proper weapons and material; the pavy exists only in name; in fact every branch of the public service calls for outlay. Meantime our expenditure is relatively small and ought to be increased.

To increase the taxes would be still more difficult and injurious, for, if we consider the condition of the tax-payers we shall find that we have imposed on them as much as they can reasonably pay. The following notice, published by the Municipality of London, will instruct our friends here how they manage those things in England, and it might be of advantage to the citizens of Buenos Ayres if our legislators &c. would adopt so business-like a precedent:--

METROPOLITAN CONSOLIDATED


