The country which has produced such men as Burke, Wellington, O'Connell, Sheridan, Moore, Goldsmith, Curran, Grattan, and so many other intellectual luminaries of the highest order needs no one to stand up and rebel the gratuitous insults of a man who yet dares to append an honored Irish name to his own Cordobese patronymic...

But how is it, we ask ourselves, that some one of the Argentine Deputies present did not protest against the aspersions on the name of Ireland? Our memory instinctively recurs to a period of 40 years ago...

IMPORTANT TO SHEEP-FARMERS. PATENT FOR EXTRACTING GREASE FROM WOOL.

Yesterday pursuant to an invitation from Major Rickard, a meeting took place at the Rural Society, 92 Calle Peru, to witness experiments of a new and valuable discovery for extracting grease from wool...

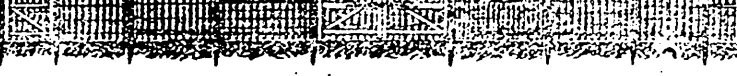

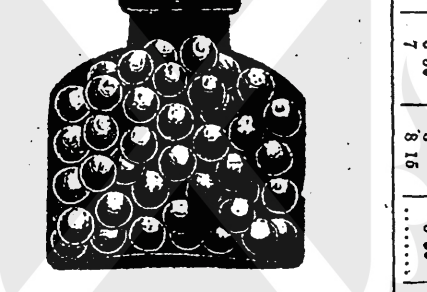

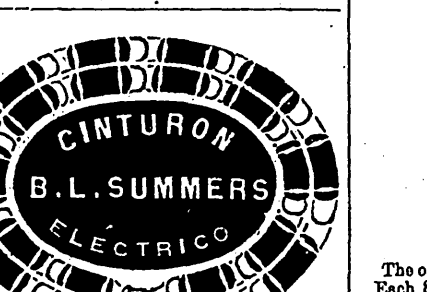
