REVIEW FOR EUROPE.

The opening of the Cordoba Exhibition takes place to-day with great solemnity, under the personal auspices of President Sarmiento. The event is one fraught with every importance for the future of these countries, and we are not surprised to hear that His Excellency has been received with the most enthusiastic rejoicings all along the route, as well as on his arrival at Cordoba, which city he reached on Wednesday evening.

The closing of Congress took place on Friday, the Chambers having disposed of all the business for which the President had prolonged the session. Their labours this year have been much shorter than usual, owing to the plague; the results are not equal to the wishes of the people, but some few measures of utility have become law.

The question of frontiers with Paraguay is about to be definitely arranged at Asunción, Baron Cotegipe and Dr. Quintana having proceeded thither as Brazilian and Argentine plenipotentiaries ad hoc.

Mr. Crawford's expedition to examine the route for a railway across the Andes will start positively this week, most of the staff being already at Chilivcoy preparing horses and supplies.

TRANSANDINE RAILWAY EXPEDITION. Mr. Robert Crawford and staff are making their final arrangements to start to-morrow or next day on one of the most remarkable expeditions of the age.

At the same time that the United States Government are preparing to start the Isthmus of Panama, and the Peruvians seek to open up communication with the Amazon by the Atlantic, it is not out of place that Buenos Ayres should make an effort to overcome the barrier of the Andes which prevents our intercourse with the West Coast.

The line we have marked with red ink on the accompanying plan explains our idea. It starts from Bragado to Fort Urjito, then to Fort Irrazabal, then to Fort Salto, and finally by San Rafael to the Planchon Pass, leaving Cerro Nevada to the South.

As the law of Feb. 1869 prolongs the Western Railway to Bragado, and the surveys from Chilivcoy to that place are already made, we fixed on Bragado as the best starting point for the expedition. The information given us by Cois, Segovia, and other gentlemen is the best that we have received, and we are confident that by this route the expedition will be perfectly secure, and the forces at the various stages be previously notified to render the engineers every assistance.

Meantime it is understood that the engineers need not follow closely the route or positions we indicate, but make such deviations as the nature of the country or their own judgment may suggest. As regards the supplies to Mr. Crawford and his staff, we shall provide them with everything as directed. We consulted Mr. Crawford as to whether he would not prefer some other route, but he replied that it was quite the same to him, and he was ready either to go straight "across the desert" or make a "devious" route, as we judged best.

As the 3rd article of the contract stipulates that the surveys are to commence at both ends, Chile and Buenos Ayres, we earnestly hope that before long the scientific announcement will be made to the world that the difficulty of crossing the Andes is overcome, and that in a few years this brilliant enterprise will be carried out to a happy conclusion.

TERRITORY OF PATAGONIA. Some of the morning papers treat at great length the possible question which may arise with Chile respecting the right to Patagonia, a territory hitherto regarded as too wild and inhospitable to be of any value. ABOUT "IAGO"

Montevideo, Oct. 13. To the Editors of the STANDARD, Gentlemen, I enjoyed the perusal of 'Iago's' letter last night, and admired his mode of attack upon my unfortunate self; but I must commence my reply by taking the liberty of seizing his battery, and turning the guns against himself.

Now, gentlemen, had this person, signing himself 'Iago,' been originally and without provocation attacked by an anonymous writer, he might have some right to demand his name. But in the present case he is a volunteer, and with the Quixotic bravery of a knight-errant has engaged in a combat with 'Othello,' led on, perhaps, by the hope of earning renown.

After voluntarily attacking me under the character of 'Othello,' what possible right can he have, after concealing himself under the name of 'Iago,' to know me under any other name than that I at present bear?
