deco's reception at Saragosa and Barcelona was magnificent. Jules Favre owing to domestic afflictions is about to retire completely from public life; it is even said he is going to enter a Carthusian monastery.

The departure of Cardinal Bonaparte for London, to see the ex-emperor, is contradicted. The Russian Cabinet is a little uneasy about the recent Austro-German conferences at Gastein.

A police conference is to be held at Munich, to check the progress of the 'international' principles. A strike among machine operatives has occurred in Belgium; the factories are closed, and the workmen crowd the streets.

Dreadful riots against the Jews have occurred in Roumania, the common people attacking them in the market-place, and but for police interference a massacre would have ensued.

The burricau at St. Thomas proved so destructive that 89 lives were lost, besides shipping disasters; an earthquake was felt at Jamaica. Mehemet Ali with 15,000 troops and a large train is not able to do much against the Albanians and has solicited reinforcements from Constantinople.

The Gastein conference is said to have resulted in an agreement between the Emperors of Germany and Austria to do their best to check 'international' tendencies, also to recognize the new order of things at Rome, but insist on guarantees in favor of the Pope.

Recent arrests have brought up the number of Communist prisoners to the fearful amount of 30,000, and no provision has been made by the Government for an adequate goal delivery. The fourth court-martial, now sitting at Versailles, has been sentencing a few obscure National Guards to 'simple deportation' for having served under the Commune.

Paris. 11th. The convention with Germany was discussed last night; after a speech from Thiers it was passed by 533 votes to 31.

THE WANDERER. October 10, 1871. A TRAVELLER'S FIRST IMPRESSIONS OF PARANA AND ITS NEIGHBORHOOD.

As my countrymen are apt to form erroneous ideas of the inland districts of this Republic, and are inclined to fancy that if they leave the civilised limits of Buenos Ayres they will have to encounter privations and annoyances for which the sight of uncultivated wastes, roaming and dangerous Gauchos, and semi-savages of all descriptions will not compensate.

Leaving Rosario and, as I expected, all civilisation behind me, I found myself in a smart little steamboat, the Estrella, of whose bluff, hearty captain and courteous purser I preserve a grateful remembrance.

Several of the guests were travelled men, who, though Argentinians, and therefore Republicans, had brought with them from their travels enlightened and appreciative opinions of England, Spain, and France.

It has been raining heavily up the country for some days past. At Rosario and other parts of Santa Fé a deluge fell. The lightning over this city on Monday night before the rain came down was remarkably vivid.

The extra traffic and receipts of the Billingham and Buenos Ayres Tramways on Sunday last found a set off in the disorderly conduct of some of the passengers, and consequent injury to the cars.

It is said, half a dozen cars so much damaged that the cost of repairing them will be considerable. It is much to be deplored that, whenever there is extra pressure on carrying companies in this country—and they make costly preparations to meet the public convenience—their reward is too often such as we record.

Fresh revelations respecting the treatment of the National Guards and other troops serving on the frontiers daily appear in the columns of our colleagues. The story of the sufferings of the Bragado National Guards on their return home lately is horrible, and the affair demands a searching investigation.

Mr. Loder, a Russian merchant, lately died in London leaving a fortune of £3,000,000, all amassed by himself in commerce.

The Governor of Santa Fé, when leaving for Cordoba, put 3000 pata in his pocket to make purchases at the auction of the Exhibition for a museum he is about to start in Santa Fé.

The drought in Entre Rios is still reported severe. To add to the evil, cattle disease is very prevalent, and the Government, to meet its heavy obligations, has raised the tax on rented public lands 100 per cent. over last year.

The works of the Transandine Telegraph line are progressing so well, that it is expected communication between Buenos Ayres and Valparaiso will be opened in February next.

A theatre at Belgrano is again, spoken of as a speculation likely to pay, and a luxury the inhabitants of that town are very anxious to possess.

Our friend Mr. Ezcurre, with that interest which he always shews in matters concerning the Southern Railway, has presented us this morning with a sample of the first new wool from Rancho by railway.

The interesting match between Mr. White's Lily and Mr. Lirington's Dexter came off at Belgrano on Sunday. The distance was four squares, native jockeys up, and even weights.

Particulars of the terrific collision between the river steamer Corumba and the Brazilian man of war Taguari, off the banks of the Obaco, have come to hand.

The Cornuba, with mails and passengers, was off the Yuelta de Aquino, Rio Paraguay, on the night of the 7th, keeping, according to sailing directions, as near to the Chaco shore as possible, and having all her lights displayed.

The Monitor de la Campana, published at Exaltacion de la Cruz, says that the new wool in that partido is remarkably clean and free from burr, and that the estancieros expect to obtain the best prices for it.

Messrs. Washington Norton and Karl Steele, with their troupe of Christy Minstrels, arrived here yesterday morning, and will make their first appearance next week, probably at the Coliseum.

They intend to remain but a short time in this city previous to visiting Rosario, Cordoba, and other places. Since we saw him last Mr. Washington Norton danced the Terpsichorean Championship of England, and won it, together with the prize of £200.

The Christy leaders look in excellent 'form,' and promise the Buenos Ayrean public many novelties.

COEDUCA. TWO NEW RAILWAYS. The past few weeks have presented a new feature in the proceedings of the Provincial Legislature.

Legislation on such matters is quite new here. During the discussion on the second of the two projects the deputies, with commendable candour, stated their want of experience in such matters—a confession implying a very strong proof of their progress.

The first project was that of a private line company, who sought and obtained permission to traverse the plaza and principal street of the city with locomotives, making three trips daily to and fro.

So erudite are idens of legislation in some minds, that a deputy publicly stated that this law would be the virtual creation of a monopoly, as no limit to tariff had been incorporated in the measure, and any freight might be exacted.

Through late in the day, discussion through the press was salutary; the proprietors of property in the streets at once presented a petition to the Municipality, begging it to reconsider or rescind its decision.

The Chambers, on their consideration of the other scheme, were more circumspect in their movements, and made several alterations in the draft bill, or project of law, as it is called here.

It is a very grateful task to call attention to the justice done by a Provincial Chamber to the grand trunk line of the country, which has been so perseveringly and inconsistently maligned in many quarters.

This petition was handed to the Resident Director in Buenos Ayres, who, in his printed reply to Dr. Sarsfield, dated July 30th, 1870, so dispassionately, judiciously and convincingly answered all the idle and false charges maliciously fabricated.

Thus, in fifteen months a complete transformation takes place. The railway that was to ruin the commerce of Cordoba is now selected among the many others of the Republic as the type for another line which will develop the resources of the entire province.

Richardieu bequeathed to his valets what they had pilloined from him, and others have left their debts as a legacy to their heirs, but this is the first time, where a man unflinchingly wills 8,000 frs. to his next of kin, all of which he had stolen in the name of law.

Once in prison, there was no chance of getting out. In fact, many of these arrests were the promptings of private revenge, a wiping out of old scores. The interrogation of Jourde, medical student and ex-chancellor of the exchange created much interest.

He made a budget speech with marvellous lucidity, and much sympathy was felt for his misapplied talent. He had no bed of roses to provide 300,000 francs daily for the Commune, but he endeavored to raise the wind as 'legally' as he could.



The *Prosa* correspondent in Cordoba estimates the attendance at the inauguration of the Exhibition on Sunday last at barely 500 people, and says that Dullness had evidently marked them for its own.

In the capital of Entre Rios new enterprises of all kinds are said to be preparing. Tramways, waterworks, gas companies, and even paving and drainage works are occupying the attention of capitalists.

Rossi performs 'Otello' to-night at the Alegria Theatre. A full and fashionable house may be expected, as the comparisons drawn between Rossi and Salvini in this character by the critics of Montevideo and Rio have awakened much interest in the lovers of Shakespeare here.

The police of this city telegraphed last week to their 'confreres' in Cordoba to keep a sharp look-out there for over 70 thieves, pickpockets, and sharpers of all kinds, who left this with the intention of seeing the Exhibition and as much of the money and watches 'd'antroi' as they can lay their hands on during their tour.

Small-pox has broken out in the northern partidos of this province. At Junio it is reported to have already carried off more persons than the last cholera.

A friend who has just arrived from Paris informs us that the accounts of the destruction caused by the Commune and the Prussian siege have been greatly exaggerated. Only the public buildings show signs of the recent turmoil.

A New York paper says—The Rev. William Morley Punshon publishes a letter to the effect that he married his deceased wife's sister, not because he liked her, but "from a praiseworthy conviction of duty."

The Rio Cuarto Railway is beginning to give value to the lands in that neighbourhood. Ten leagues of land in the province of San Luis, belonging to Juan Saa, the famous cabecilla of the Pucoto, have just been rented to some Chileans for one thousand doubloons a year for 'invernadas' of cattle.

The Tribunal of Montevideo mentions that some uneasiness was felt in the sister city on Friday night last in consequence of a report getting abroad that the rebels had approached Pando, and were to be aided by a 'coup de main' within the capital.

The works on the Central Uruguay line are now pushed to a quarter of a mile beyond Colorado.

The *Opinion Nacional* of Rosario says the boatmen there charge three Bolivians per head for landing passengers from the steamers. Rather sharp, this! yet the police keep never minding.

The *Asociacion* papers announce a growing antipathy to foreigners in Paraguay, and the *Pueblo* says the latter will all have to decamp with the baggage guard of the Brazilians when they leave. Poor Paraguay is still going the wrong way.

The Transandine Railway expedition left yesterday morning. Mr. Crawford and all his subordinates looked well, and as if their professional souls were in arms and ready for any fray with Natur or Indians.

The following intelligence in the *Daily News* has startled European Swiss tourists for their propriety; any of our readers meditating doing Switzerland should take a note of it: "People who go to Switzerland should be careful about bathing in the Lake of Wallenstadt. We are informed that a number of persons, excursionists probably, who ventured to swim in this water in the course of the season, never came out of it, either alive or dead, and the matter has at last been made the subject of a serious investigation.

National prosperity may not absolutely involve national happiness and national safety, but it is fair to presume that the nation which prospers in its commerce is at once happy and

secure. The comforting assurance that we are prospering in trade, that our population, growing richer every year, is enabled to enjoy an increasing proportion of luxuries, and that fiscal burdens, while constantly made lighter to the consumer, are at the same time steadily becoming more productive to the Exchequer, may give us some comfort in the midst of our Military shortcomings and Naval disasters. The Report of the Commissioners of Customs for the year 1870 furnishes ample proof that, however we may blunder elsewhere, the commerce of England has not been damaged by any recent changes at home or abroad. Our entire trade in the past year was absolutely the largest that we, or any other nation, have ever done in the same period. Our imports from foreign countries and British possessions abroad amounted to £303,000,000, nearly eight millions more than those of 1869. Our exports amounted to £244,000,000, nearly seven millions more than those of 1869. It is not enough, however, to compare the statistics of this unparalleled commerce with those of the preceding year alone, which just reached the level of 1866, once deemed a year of unexampled activity in trade. Let us go back to the year 1854, a time of sufficient commercial energy. The Crimean War had not yet checked trade; still our imports and exports in that year were barely more than half the value of our imports and exports in 1870. And yet during half the year distinguished in our fiscal annals by the attainment of a height of commercial prosperity never reached before a disastrous war was raging between two of the most powerful and wealthy of our Continental neighbours.

One of the most interesting questions which arose in regard to our commerce in the year 1870 was connected with the war between Germany and France. Should we lose or should we profit by it? The matter was doubtful; for though it was clear that in some respects we should gain largely by the partial paralysis of the French and German trade, formidable rivals being thus for the time taken out of the way, it was apprehended, on the other hand, that the market for our commodities in one or both countries might be closed to us, and that, in consequence of financial disturbances, commercial transactions might be brought to a standstill.

The proposals for the Santa Fe road to Belgrano were opened yesterday at the Provincial Government House. The proposers—George Crawford and Co., M. Billinghurst and Co., W. Livingstone and Son, Alvino Barker, & the Municipality, having received an advance of five millions currency from the Provincial Bank, are now paying off their most pressing claims.
