A very important decision has been given by the Supreme Court. The Prov. Legislature passed a law obl ging the banks to redebn their notes payable in Bolivian money with gold, if requirbreaks his neck on the pier, no atten- ed to do so. A person took a thousand dollars worth of Bolivian notes to the Argentine Bank and demanded their equivalent in gold. The Bankrefused to pay gold, under the plea that the recent law was unconstitutional, but offered Bo. livian specie. Hence the suit, which was decide ed in favor of the Bank by the judges in Resario. This decision was appealed from the Lower Court to the Supreme Court, and was reversed by that august body. So it is decided that although bank note may say on its face that it is payable in Bolivian, the payment of its equivalent in gold, as the only legal tender, may be enforced. I am inclined to approve of this decision, as it will tend to do away with our variety of money types, and accustom the people to the legal type of the hard dollar, sixteen to the ounce. Talking of money, when are we to have a mint and national coinage?
