EDITOR'S TABLE. The concert on Friday evening on the occasion of the inauguration of the new organ at the German Church proved one of the greatest musical successes known in this city for some time.

We have seldom heard such general praise of any amateur performance. We publish some remarks on it in our leading columns.

The latest intelligence of the belligenents in the Banda Oriental represents Aparicio as retreating on Tacuambó, and his forces much demoralised by their recent reverses at Salto and Paysandu.

In answer to our urgent appeal for some information respecting the deserted city of Oran, all our leading colleagues published yesterday some few particulars concerning the unfor-

tunate town. They seem, however, to have been quite as 'hard up' as ourselves for their source of information.

Oran was founded in 1793 by Captain General Juan G. Pizarro, near an old Indian settlement, and was situated about midway between Jujuy, Bolivia, and the River Vermejo.

Those who have visited it declare it to have been a pretty little town, with two plazas, a church, streets 15 metres in width, and intersected in many parts by narrow canals for irrigation purposes.

Sugar, tobacco, maudico, and the banana were extensively cultivated in its neighborhood, the climate being tropical during the best part of the year.

Oran was 80 leagues from Salta, and 60 from Jujuy, and had a population of 8,000 souls. The last census in 1854 gave 6,000.

We have as yet had no application for the pocket-book found by one of the members of our staff some days ago.

We have therefore determined that unless it be claimed before twelve o'clock to-morrow, we shall forward it, with its contents (\$91 mc, a photographer's bill, a pencil, card, and a letter from France) to what we consider under the circumstances the most appropriate quarter, viz: to the Rev. D. Chapp, U.S. Chargé d'Affaires, for the Chicago Relief Fund.

There is quite a hubbub at the Tigre in consequence of the Government closing the shipyards there on a pretext that will not 'hold water' for a moment.

There is not one opinion in town on the subject, and it is that the sooner such an unpardonable interference with industry is abandoned, and the decree ordering it cancelled, the better it will be for the credit of the Government.

The attention of speculators is beginning to be seriously attracted towards Belgrano, which from its close proximity to town and its unequalled situation, is destined to become the favorite suburb of Buenos Ayres.

Before the end of next year it is to be hoped that one, if not two tramways will place it in immediate communication with the city.

The Northern Railway will most likely have established a double line by that time; and two more railways—the Campana line and the one to Rosario—will have pushed their works far in that direction.

Mr. Olguin's project of establishing a gasometer, thanks to the very decided support he has met with from the authorities and the public in general, will also shortly be a fait accompli; and in connection with it, the iron mole with a bathing establishment connected with the centre of the village by a tramway.

Under these circumstances, it is not to be wondered at that house property should be most sought after in and near Belgrano.

A day or two ago we visited a charming little 'chalef' lately built and admirably adapted for a summer residence for one or two bachelors; we understand it is for sale. The owner would sell it on very advantageous terms—that is, he would rent it for an amount that would include amortization, so that at the end of a specified number of years the tenant would have paid up the capital and become owner of the property.

It is charmingly situated in the Calle Tucuman, between Moreno and Castelli, and is built upon a piece of ground 30x50. Mr. Ristorini, the auctioneer, is charged with the disposal of the property, and full particulars may be obtained from him at his office, Li-na, 56.
