



The America went down at 9 o'clsck on Sunday morning: the prow and a piece of machinery are sticking out of water. The Commissary of the Cerro spent all the day along the coast, looking out for corpses; some have been picked up at Flores Island, 10 miles below Montevideo. The remains of Mme. Inurrieta and Mme. Barneche were interred at Montevideo, with every mark of respect. Only 27 bodies have since been picked up, none of Bossi's sailors have been arrested at Montevideo, but he is, himself, safe aboard an Italian gumboat.




