OUR RELATIONS WITH CHILE

The vicissitudes of life, especially in Spanish Republics, could not have been better exemplified than in the scene at the Government House on Wednesday when the son of an Irish doctor of Valparaiso was received in diplomatic state as Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of the very country in which President Sarmiento passed some of his earlier years as a schoolmaster.

What strange recollections must have crossed the minds of both men on the occasion, at the same time affording honest motive for pride! Twenty-five years ago Domingo Sarmiento came Johnny Blest for his grammar. Since then the master and the pupil have risen to such eminence as only one man in a million can attain, and both have owed their distinction to brilliant literary talents and at least average integrity of purpose.

The Chilean Minister in his speech on Wednesday evoked the recollection of General San Martin crossing the Andes to help the Chileans in the war of Independence, but we could wish that it were unnecessary to disturb the dusty records of 60 years ago for arguments of mutual interest and service rendered. Except on occasion of the Mendoza earthquake, the burning of the Compañia church, the bombardment of Valparaiso and the recent plague of Buenos Ayres, there has scarcely been any intercourse between the sister-republics, as if only adversity can elicit the latent spark of kindliness which long forgetfulness had almost extinguished.

There is, however, a better time coming, and Chile has set the example by a long era of peace and industry which has raised her to undisputed pre-eminence in the eyes of Europeans as the first of Spanish Republics. Until recently she was considered the only one of any respectability, but since the reorganization of the Argentine Confederacy this country has been pushing close on Chile and seems destined to surpass her.

The extradition of criminals was, if we rightly remember, convened by treaty some time since, but it must be considered a dead letter when we read by last mails from Chile that the assassin Farias, who murdered Mr. Jameson's comrades two years ago in the Cordillera, has been released and allowed to start in business at Sta. Rosa de los Andes.

LONDON LETTER.

London, Jan. 8, 1872.

The monarchism and ultramontane revival goes on vigorously. The Gods are certainly propitious. EDITORS TABLE.

The Post Office remained open till a later hour than usual on Thursday evening for the delivery of the Duro's mails, which proved a great convenience to many, enabling them to answer their letters by the steamer City of Rio, which sailed yesterday afternoon for Antwerp and Liverpool.

The beauties of the famous Boyne, the historic interest of the battle field where the Second James's last hopes were overthrown, an inspection of Slane Castle and its art treasures, together with the other innumerable attractions of the north-west coast, are to be enjoyed on His Majesty's newest vessel for his homeward voyage, and we trust he may have favourable gales to waft him back to his loving subjects.

The hands of the various 'comparsons' have been discoursing through the streets for the last three nights music, which, if not eloquent, or even of average quality, has been, at least, unimpeachable as to quantity. Crowds of 'gamins' and jdlers follow the musicians through the streets till that time of the morning known as 'all hours,' to the considerable inconvenience of the inhabitants of the city. Civinini, whose parents were in humble circumstances, was born at Estosia in 1810. He was a member of the *Nazione* and represented at the funeral.

The steamer Espora is the floating lazzaretto at Euseada. We hear the accommodation on board is superior to that on land; as regards the charges, we have as yet heard nothing. The lazzaretto at Martin Garcia is to be a splendid edifice, and the affairs of the island are to be put on a completely new footing.

Yesterday the *Porfena* came up from Montevideo, bringing the mails. It is now so difficult to get anything from the Mount save a laconic telegram, that the papers yesterday were most refreshing.

All the articles of the Argentine papers on the Paraguayan question have been translated into Portuguese and published in Rio. This was a very ill-advised step, as it worked up the Brazilian public to a pitch of the most irascible indignation. Things begin to look bloody crochety, owing to this groundless question; let us hope it will blow over.

Letters from Paraguay state that there is scarcely anything talked of in Asuncion but the Gran Chaco business, and that Paraguay is determined to resist the claims of the Argentine Republic.

We learn from a well informed Argentine that the question of limits in the Chaco is older than the present century; that the Argentine Republic has always claimed the territory at present in dispute, and never recognised the right of Paraguay to it; that Francia, the tyrant of Paraguay, shut the river and seized the Chaco, which Lopez subsequently held and tried to colonise; and that the Argentine Republic, in now occupying the Chaco, only takes what was her own. Furthermore, that in ancient times was never questioned by any power save Bolivia. As we confess to an utter ignorance of the question of title, being unable to find any history or book referring to it either at Messrs. Hilbert's or Messrs. Mackern's, we give our readers what we hear on the subject. We have seen the Chaco, and for days sailed by its lonely shores—a bleak, sterile spot, and the whole place not worth the smallest building site at the Lomas de Zamora or Quilmes.
