ALL anxiety respecting the Gran Chaco business has subsided. General Vedia, on behalf of the Argentine Government, has taken formal possession of the Chaco; Paraguay recorded a protest, and thus the matter stands.

The rumors during the fortnight of the resignation of the Minister of Interior have been officially contradicted, and no immediate change is at present spoken of in the Cabinet.

The Corrientes revolution continues, notwithstanding the various triumphs of the Government troops under Gen. Babiéne. The country districts are now held by the Government troops; but the city remains in the power of the rebels, who refuse to come to any terms, and are making every preparation for a prolonged resistance.

The chief event of the fortnight has been the rupture of the Oriental peace negotiations, so long going on in this city. The peace treaty was actually signed by the respective commissioners; but the anti-peace party in Montevideo made such a noise about it, that the debilitated Governor of Montevideo was compelled to repudiate the act of his own commissioner.

No attempt was afterwards made till 1826, when Pablo Soria, Lake Cressell (an Englishman) and some others, descended the Bermejo in 57 days, and were seized at the mouth by orders of Francia, who held them captives in Paraguay to some years.

A more recent attempt by Mr. Hickman, an American, was made in 1852, but poor Hickman died on the voyage, and Captain Page mentions visiting his grave on the banks of the Bermejo in his surveys for the United States Government in 1853. Later on, Sr. Arce, a Bolivian, descended the river in rafts laden with merchandise, in 1856, and again in 1863.

Thus the whole question seemed to resolve itself into the canalization of the Teuco, and this arduous work has just been accomplished after great labor and trouble. It will be remembered that Mr. Roldán and Capt. Page started from Buenos Ayres just after the plague, and from time to time we have had occasion to report their progress in the face of great obstacles.

At one place where the Government agent was to meet them with provisions the former made no appearance nor sent any food, and Capt. Page had to send a forlorn hope, through enemies held by hostile Indians to procure relief from the nearest settlement. The little steamer safely reached Esquina Grande, and how much is due of the success of the expedition to Captain Page we shall not now attempt to decide, for we feel certain that D. Natalio Roldán will himself, be the first to testify the valuable co-operation of so experienced an explorer as the former commander of the Water-Vitch and "Pilcomayo."

The diversion of the river Teuco may seem simple enough to our readers, who are accustomed to such feats as the Mont Cenis tunnel or the Suez Canal, but it must be considered what number of difficulties present themselves in this country.

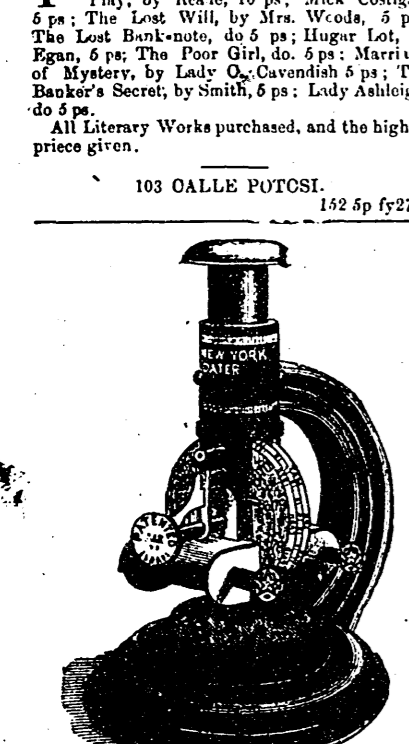
