But now that they must be convinced that the only protection they are to receive must be such as their own right arms and stout hearts can provide, they will, no doubt, at once arm and organize themselves in such a manner as to be impervious to any situation tender or imperatively necessary.

I would suggest to them that, having first taken such measures, it might be good policy for them to try to come to some amicable understanding with the tribe of Calafueta, intimating to him their desire to live on friendly terms with his people, and their willingness to pay to him at stated periods certain articles and stores, not only as rent for the lands occupied, but also for freedom from molestation by his own and any others he might be able to induce to join him.

At same time among other stipulations one must be to the effect that no armed Indian should approach within a given distance of any settler's house without incurring the risk of being shot—and, on the other hand, that no Englishman should join Government forces for the purpose of hostilities there. Should any such idea find favor with our countrymen, I think they would find little difficulty in obtaining access, and a safe escort to and from the Cañon of Las Salinas, and perhaps an imposing document with a large seal from H.B.M.'s Representative to be delivered by a person in a scarlet coat and cocked hat might have considerable influence, or at any rate be of more service than fifty letters to Dr. Tejedor. Had our countrymen on the Chupui, been so unfortunate as to have enjoyed the protection of Dr. Tejedor and the Government forces, the chances are they would long since have been exterminated, whereas, being left to their own devices, they remained on such friendly terms with the Indians as to receive supplies of provisions and other assistance from them—and this suggests the idea that Mr. Jones had better consider well the kind of protection that will be inflicted upon him wherever he now pitches his tent. Lieut. Musters, as may be seen by his book, lived nine months among the Indians—so that the Indians themselves cannot be such a bad lot, and if fairly treated there is every reason to suppose that a frontier life, adopting proper precautions and at times keeping your powder dry (as parties should now do at every estancia in the country), would not be a life of such great peril; so far, at any rate, as the Indians are concerned—and it is a question whether there are not now more 'Christians' prowling about the frontiers than in any other part of the camp?

How pitiable it is to see so much fine country being given up to marauding lives have been lost to the country since the fall of Rosario. What stock had not only been lost, carried off, but has been starved on the overstocked and exhausted camps of the Interior! What a wretched and suicidal policy! railways and tramways, telegraphs and port schemes will be of little use if our camps are to be narrowed instead of extended!

Apologizing for the length of this letter, and hoping that my suggestion may be of some use to settlers in Bahia Blanca, I remain, Gentlemen, SYMPATHIZER.

HYPOTHECARY BANK. To the Editors of the STANDARD. Gentlemen, As several persons who have applied to me for information on the working of this bank were under the impression that besides an annual payment of 11 per cent. they would also have to pay back the capital or sum borrowed at the expiration of 20 years, &c., I beg your permission to correct this idea through your columns.

The bank, having approved the title-deeds of any property of a fixed and lasting nature, does not lend the money itself, but guarantees the loan on it to the amount of half its value, which value is determined by the Contribution Directa, or by a fresh valuation effected with the bank's consent.

The borrower pays off that loan altogether within a certain number of years by an annual sum of either 10 per cent. or 12 per cent. divided into either quarterly or half-yearly payments, as he may choose.

Supposing the annual or yearly sum to be 11 per cent., and the payment to be made half-yearly, then by paying 5 1/2 per cent. every six months for a period of 20 years and 100 days, or a little more than six months, he will be altogether clear of the debt.

He can also clear off the debt at any time during those 20 years by any lump payment of the balance still due, or a payment of one-third part of the mortgage on the day of his maturity, which he may do at any time accepted by the bank, and the interest reduced in proportion.
