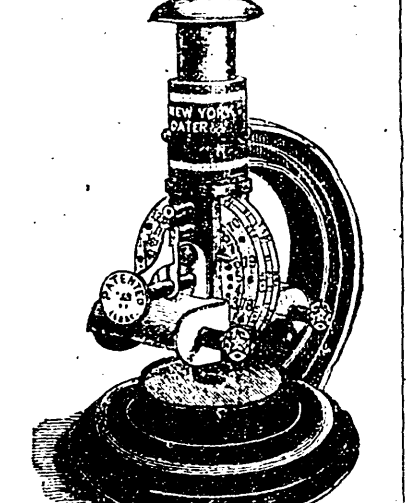

The progress along the Uruguay is therefore purely artificial, the Saladeros thrive because it is the only real industry suitable. In Entre Rios the troperos do a fair and legitimate business in bringing troops of fat cattle from Corrientes, now the hotbed of revolution and selling them to the saladeristas of Gualeguayacu and Concepcion.

In Entre Rios there are some signs of a disposition on the part of the government to help the trade of the Uruguay, and there is reason to hope that, now that some very wealthy men of Buenos Ayres are purchasing largely and investing in estancias, saladeros and other property, the prospects of the Province are brightening.

GREAT SOUTHERN RAILWAY. IMPORTANT MEETING. London, Feb. 14, 1872. The Extraordinary general meeting of the shareholders of the Great Southern Railway took place this afternoon at 1 o'clock in the Cannon St. Hotel.

The adoption was seconded by Mr. Horepath and opposed by Mr. Ford, who at great length set forward the legal objections to the alterations of the original articles of association. The objections he characterized as a breach of faith, as it had been expressly determined that the capital and accounts of additional works should be kept separate from those of the original line.

The learned gentleman continued to enlarge on the dangers of a premature arrangement on the faith of the main line earning 9 per cent, when it was only problematical that the Salado line would earn as much; and before the amalgamation was decided upon, why he asked, should not the shareholders be first satisfied on that point?

Mr. Quilter rose to beg the Chairman not to allow any more speculating by proxy, as many shares as he hoped the Directors would go on with the amalgamation, and the shareholders would follow them with their support, even into Chancery.

Next week will be studded with holidays. Monday (Lady Day), Thursday and Friday being "dies non," and Saturday half-day. Many parties meditate trips to the Mount and camp (W.V.P.), but it looks as if neither authority will give the necessary permission.

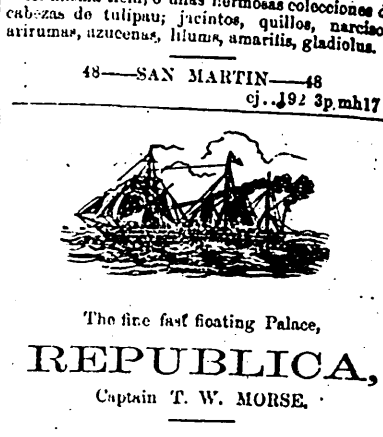
