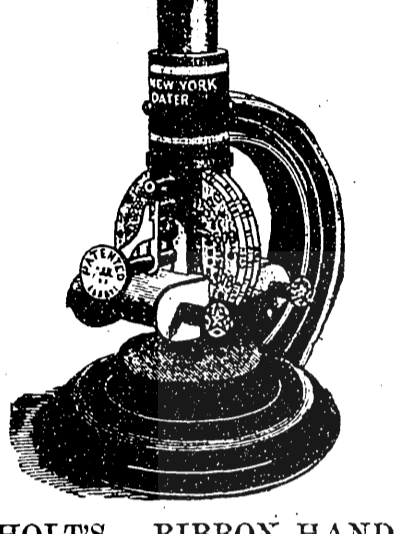

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LATEST FROM BRAZIL.

RAILWAYS, COLONIES AND PUBLIC WORKS. Rio Janeiro papers to the 6th. inst. show that thirty new railways are either in course of construction or contracted for in divers places all over the empire.

1. Rio Grande and Candiota; engineers commenced surveys March 10th. 2. Pelotas to San Lorenzo colony; concessionaire Mr. Edward Musler.

3. Pernambuco extension; Mr. Joseph Wirth C.E. to make surveys. 4. Bahia branch, Lazaros to Soledade; to be completed in 4 months.

5. Pernambuco and Bebedouro; concession passed by Chambers. 6. Nazareth and Timbaupá, branch of the above, voted. 7. Tramway branch to Escadão, same line.

8. Uua branch, concession under debate. 9. San Paulo and Sorocaba, 7 per cent. guarantee on £300,000. 10. Maxambomba to Santa Cruz (Pedro II line) concession sought by Mr. Thomas Cochrane.

11. Rio Janeiro to Santa Theresa, tramway, proposals received to April 30th. 12. Prazo Pedro II to Passelo Publico, tramway, do.

13. Ceará and Baturité, rails and locomotives expected from England. 14. Santos to Jundiá, direct, 16 miles, shares all taken up.

15. Rezendé (Rio Janeiro) to Areas (San Paulo); surveys begun by Galvan and Leite. 16. Jundiá and Campinas, to be completed next month.

17. Jundiá to Belém, guaranteed for 30 years. 18. Branch line to Braganza, guaranteed during construction.

19. Campinas to Mugy-nirim, guaranteed on £150,000. 20. Guaratinguetá and Santos; engineers making out the route.

PARIS LETTER.

March, 2th, 1872. France protests against the sterility of its Assembly, not alone in its inability to produce salutary measures, but also to terminate its onerating contests.

Mr. Peckins, the Superintendent of the Central Argentine Company, met with an accident in the colony of Bernstadt the other day, and is confined to his bed in his quinta at that place.

Several shares in the Italo Platense Steam Navigation Company have been taken up in Rosario, and we anticipate a great success for the Company.

It is pleasant to witness a friendly, sympathetic feeling strengthening itself between the provinces of Buenos Ayres and Santa Fe. Time was—but why recall the recent past? Better fix our attention on the present and on the future.

The elections for Governor in your province excited almost as much interest here as they did in B. Ayres, and the result is here considered a grand triumph of principles over individuals.

The railways to the Rio Grande coal-fields will soon develop this new staple in the south of the empire. Mr. Johnson and his staff are at work on the Arroyo das Ratas; and Messrs. George Milner, J. B. Hudson and White who recently arrived at Rio Grande from Europe, left that city on the 19th ult. for Santa Isabel en route to Candiota, to survey the line proposed by the South Brazilian Railway Co. Limited, and report on the condition and prospects of the coal-fields.

On the 21st we are to have our elections, not for Governor, I am sorry to say, but for the new Legislature, which, according to the new constitution, is to be composed of two chambers—senators and deputies.

The telegraph is another thing in the way of improvements. The Government has ratified the statutes of the Rio Grande Co. capital £40,000; the promoters Duran and Irick get £5,000 for their rights.

The Municipality of Rosario has opened two schools, one for boys and another for girls. The number of pupils is to be 500. This is always of some importance.

These six or eight leagues at this time of the year when the days are becoming short, are run after nightfall. The other day or night, the train was stoned, and a passenger, a French gentleman was badly hurt.

from the Government of Rio Grande do Norte. An interesting ceremony took place at Ceará on March 17th, the blessing of Sor Montero's new brick-making machine, just received from Messrs. Clayton and Co. of England.

Three large steamers are being built in England for the New York and Brazil line. A new line of powerful steamers (called the Chargeurs Reunis Co.) will begin running from Havre to Brazil and La Plata, next November.

Great efforts are being made in the way of colonization. The Province of Rio Grande has sent for 40,000 more Germans. The Imperial Government has contracted for 100,000 English in ten yearly batches of 10,000 each.

At the same time the quotations of railways and other stock in Brazil are so flattering as to give a good omen for all these new enterprises. In another column we give the quotations, ranging from 11 to 440 premium. It is very plain that Brazil is going ahead.

It is said that Governor Iriónio is to be in Rosario in a few days; probably to prevent the authorities from meddling in the elections.

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Bastille. If the due d'Annale can prove this, supposing the trial to last as long as that of the "Tribuna," the Comte de Chambord's right divine is at an end.

After all the other conspirators dread the Bonapartists, and a vague feeling exists there are but too good grounds for the apprehension entertained. The radical journals roundly assert the police have a "Chislehurst leaning," and the force ought to be pressed at once.

The Liberal Society has received its death-blow, not only by the commission appointed to report upon the scheme, but by the Home Minister. In supporting both the severely to be executed and the outrageously to be pardoned, he has shown the less because it was painful.

Countert the painter, who, as a member of the Commune, was sentenced to six months imprisonment for deprecating the demolition of the Bastille.

While scanning a New York paper yesterday the following paragraph struck us. We did not hit back, but seized the editor's trustiest weapon, the scissors, and captured it.

The Rosario Press calls loudly for the execution of Barrera, a miscreant condemned to death months ago for murdering a poor old woman and two children while they were asleep in their beds.

The tramway asunto in Rosario is not settled yet, in consequence of one honorable town-councillor in the Corporation "stopping the way."

A man and wife were arrested yesterday for furious fighting, yelling and disorder in the public streets. They had taken some Welsh punch, made from the receipt published in this paper, but the police don't know this.

Marguerite, Signor Piccoli, as Faust, was very evidently still under the influence of his recent cold, and must await another opportunity of hearing him to advantage.

The s.s. Camoens, on her last trip from Rio Grande to Rio Janeiro, was in considerable danger of descending from the Claret, which sails on the 11th inst.

The South African Diamond Fields are now the theme of daily conversation with enterprising young Britishers here, and there is a growing feeling amongst them to have a try at fortune-making.

The remains of the late Señora de Senillosa were interred on Sunday at the Recoleta. The attendance comprised members of all the leading Portuguese families on the cortege.

Some incredulous subscribers appeared on Saturday to doubt that we had a Times of the 15th ult. in Standard Court.

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Hall a dozen committees for balls, fireworks, illuminations, flowers, hot cakes, nuttins, etc. have been named in Montevideo to conduct this peace-rejoicing.

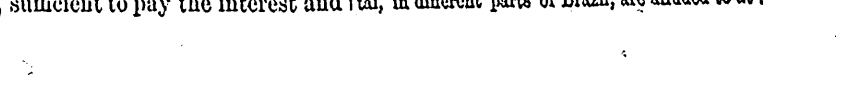
