They started from the Chilian side and found a slit in the Andes which they followed till the 4th inst. on which day they report progress, from the Argentine side, and say that no natural obstacle is met with, but a steady line of gradual ascent on one side and fall on the other, the incline never exceeding 21 per cent. or an inch per yard. so that nothing could be easier (says Governor Videla) than to make either a wagon-road or railway by Los Patos into Chile. The slit in the Andes discovered as above is not exactly at Los Patos, but 13 miles south of that pass.


