pearance the plan seems vast, something like what we should expect to see at Millbank Penitentiary, still it will hardly be any larger than we actually require. It will accommodate 600 men and 100 women, which is not much above the number usually in detention at the Cabildo and other prisons in our city. We are not informed what the cost of the work may be, or where it is proposed to place it. Perhaps the 'barranca' of the Convalecencia would be the best locality. As regards the cost there should be no hesitation on this head; an institution after Mr. Bunge's model is just what we require, much more so than a new Provincial Bank, and the Government should at once take it in hand. Our present prison system, in the words of Dr. Esteves Sagué, is a disgrace to any country that calls itself civilized.

The Men's Hospital, which it is proposed to erect on a site adjoining the Irish Convent in Calle Rio Bamba will be a magnificent institution, similar to those of Brazil or Montevideo which have so often merited the praise of physicians and travellers. It will cover 8 acres or two manzanas, between the streets Temple, Rio Bamba, Paraguay and Ayacucho; for which end it will be necessary to close up that part of Calle Cordoba from Rio Bamba to Ayacucho; this would cause no inconvenience to the public.

The Hospital is arranged to hold 472 beds, in this manner. The central building is devoted to the apartments for officials, the chapel, dispensary, store-rooms, linen-closets, kitchens, baths, wash-house &c. The two wings are made like the letter E; each has 3 long wards with beds on either side, each ward holding 80 beds, and the row of building which connects the wards at right angles is devoted to operation halls, library, visitors' room &c. There are six gardens, each covering an acre, between the various wings, with corridors and galleries for convalescents to take the air. The whole hospital is to be surrounded by a wall, and a few yards inside the entrance gate the visitor sees the facade of the central building, 150 feet long. The wings on either side present a front of 200 feet each: a garden runs all round under the wall which surrounds the oblong area of 8 acres. We have nothing to suggest in the way of improvement, for the plan seems perfect in all particulars: the site, too, is much better than the present wretched locality near San Telmo.

The plans of the new Orphan Asylum suggest an enlargement of the present school adjoining the Merced church, which Rivadavia gave the orphans when the premises at San Miguel were found too small for them. Mr. Bunge proposes erecting allos all round the central garden, which has an extent of 2,500 square yards or half-an-acre, making also a passage into Calle 25 de Mayo beside the English church. It appears to us that it would be better and cheaper to build an Orphanage out of town, as the site next the Merced is very valuable and would fetch as much as the cost of a new building: the air of the suburbs would also be healthier for the children.

Buenos Ayres has room for much improvement in the way of charitable and public institutions, which are even more necessary than tramways or railways, and will prove quite as beneficial to the community. We shall rejoice to see the new Prison and Men's Hospital as a first instalment, and hope when the good work is once begun our citizens will not stay their hands until this populous and growing capital be able to boast as fine a collection of public institutions as our Brazilian neighbors or our North American consins.

insidious signs, until support was no longer necessary, and then it was crushed in the parasitic embrace. In a brief space we can trace the cause of this decadence. In no country have old habits and customs undergone a greater change within the last 15 years than Buenos Ayres. Socially the people have changed as much as the external appearance of their city has altered; and a resident of 20 years standing is in doubt whether to regret more the old primitive habits and general hospitality, or to rejoice in the giant strides which civilization is making towards European civilization. No great sketch of memory is required to carry us back to the time when our plazas were "casaca heaps, our streets unpeaved and unpaved, no gas, no mole, no railways, no tramways, no water-works, no country residences. Our only outings were to Palermo in the evening, and to the retreat at night; our only opera house the Argentine Theatre, and yet this centralization was delightful. We knew everybody, and were known by all. Everybody was in town and at home. But the more modern civilization has changed all this. The railway, the tramway, and the macadamised roads have revolutionized our society, and like ambitious chasm—

'Who's who' to-day in South America with all its sheep-farms, coffee-plantations, silver-mines, and esparto-fields! Here is a stranger invested with sudden power, like Sancho Panza in his island territory. Duffy knows his territory and his people, and ascribes the debility of the people to the miserable habit of taking maté. The finest whiskey could be brewed in the Chaco, if the aborigines over whom Mr. Duffy now rules could be got to give over maté-drinking. Not on the world's chart can there be found a spot more adapted for potato-growing than the banks of the Vermejo, yet the people prefer mandioca.

To raise the Chaco to its proper place, the first thing necessary is to teach the people what to eat and drink. The influence of diet on a nation is accepted by every statesman as of the highest importance. Buckwheat cakes and molasses have done far more for the Americans than they are willing to admit. A nation bred on such diet can never be kept back. There is no limit to the future of a new country where the food of the people is properly attended to; and we are with Mr. Duffy in his views of epicurean reformation.

National modesty forbids our running over the long hero-roll of Irishmen who have figured at home and abroad since Sir Walter Raleigh imported potatoes into Ireland.
