CITY IMPROVEMENTS.

The special committee has finally

issued its sentence on the Bateman

project and resolved to accept it sub-

ject to two important modifications:

1st. The irrigation system as at Croydon

is to be adopted, instead of throwing

the drainage into the River Plate;

2ndly the water-supply is to be taken

either from Olivos or Paraná de las

Palmas, instead of the present place

near the Gas-house.

This decision exactly meets the

views we have agitated for some years

back, and only last Saturday we said

"we hope the committee will not ac-

cept the Bateman project unless

"modified so as to admit the Croydon

"system of irrigation." The report of

the committee fully justifies so im-

portant an alteration, and although

the name of Mr. Bateman stands among

the highest in such matters we ven-

ture to say that his project would

have caused grave peril to our city if

carried out as he proposed.
