RETIREMENT OF GOVERNOR CASTRO.

Yesterday the Provincial Chambers met to receive the farewell address of Governor Castro and to elect a new Governor for the Province of Buenos Ayres.

At 1 p.m. the band marched from the Government House and struck up the National Hymn and other soul-stirring strains.

At the conclusion of this speech there was great cheering in the house, the Secretary of the Chambers then commenced the reading of the message which lasted precisely 20 minutes.

The Governor's Message makes a passing allusion to the Tandil massacre, as a proof that one of the first cares of the Legislature should be to establish a proper police-force in all the country districts.

The Secretary then called the Acta, and the house adjourned for five minutes to summon the Governor.
