FINANCE REPORT OF B. AYRES. Minister Agote in concluding his term of office furnishes his usual yearly report of the finances of the Provinces with great minuteness and detail.

The provincial revenue last year was 37 1/2 millions, or 4 millions less than for 1870, being about equal to the returns for 1869. It is made up as follows—

There is a falling-off of 2 millions in the saladeros and nearly the same under the heading of Patentes: 10 to 9 millions, those for the country also diminishing about 15 per cent.

The Contribution Directa is the same, showing an increase of 1/4 million in the city and a corresponding decline in the camp; the proportion of receipts is 5-sevenths for the city and 2-sevenths for the camp.

So far from Paris, box symbolizes the triumphal chariot, and a certain whether the Prussians packed up with the French clocks the few palmiers that flourished near St. Cloud, but these trees have disappeared since the investment; they remain, the halt and the blind, the old and the young, found a brisk sale at their booths of box for a sous; there were vegetable barricades of this shrub outside the gates of the churches; the waggoner and the cab man alike stopped to purchase, and decorate their horse's heads with the evergreen, while no doubt their wives had obtained a supply blessed to hang over the bed and the toilette table. At the Madeleine the tomb of the Abbé Deguery, who was assassinated under the Commune, was the object of a pious pilgrimage, and was literally covered with wreaths, violets, and camellias. At Marsailles there was a poulterer ceremony, in remembrance of the spot where Lazarus, accompanied by his sisters, is said to have landed, and his resurrection. France is very rich in kindred records; she claims to be the first dry land that appeared after the universal deluge. Everywhere exist the evidences of Easter—to say nothing of the snow and hail which Winter hurls as Persian arrows, the toy and sweet-meat shops are full of egg-allusions; from birds negotiating their free-love unions; eggs, from a circus to an ostrich's, to where birds in their little nests agree. There are dolls in sugar, dressed in tulle and Valenciennes, looking as coy as brides, under their long veils, and carrying baskets of eggs or snow drop bouquets these are intended "carrots"—to represent the king of that name who draws crowds to the theatre where he holds away over every other vegetable—filled with lollipops, sufficient to stock any nursery against seven years of famine, as well as contributing to the weekly 6000 deaths in the "other causes" column of the Registrar's statistics. The most curious spectacle I ever witnessed was outside the church of Notre Dame des Victoires, where nine tall footmen were ranged beside the railings, each with a poodle dog under his arm, to hand the little darlings "smelling of musk and insolence" to their mistresses, on the completion of their devotions. I can now understand why a well-known duchess orders the carriage to drive her pet pug solely in the Champs Elysees.

It has been said that ridicule kills respecting duelling. Formerly when no sought redress by arms, the affair was conducted quietly and in a business-like way. But we have changed all that, and a duel is announced beforehand for the papers; it supplies paragraphs to the press, it is a spectacle limited to a select audience. On Sunday last two editors fought, with not the slightest idea of killing each other. One antagonist begged pardon of his opponent for awkwardness in fencing, as he knew nothing of the art; this may explain how he received an accidental scratch on the ribs, when the seconds interfered, the doctor certified &c. and a history of the terrible combat was signed by the high contracting parties. Bulletins were issued from time to time, that the wounded man was progressing as favorably as could be expected; friends called and left their cards, while the patient was all the while occupied with his usual journalistic duties. What makes a freerholder hold both sides at the same time, is the seriousness with which so keen a people take such regard it. Until some duellists be killed, the modern plan of settling affairs of honor will likely continue.

The Patriotic Fund still persists in collecting subscriptions for paying off the German ransom debt. The ladies display no faltering in soliciting the smallest contributions, of which they receive a great many. One lady, the wife of an important 'chief' in the Treasury, received fourteen sous as the result of her day's application from house to house on Monday; she will likely retire, as on applying to one family the heads of it demanded her authority for collecting; she had forgotten it, and her card, she was then set upon, accused of being a swindler, was dragged down the stairs, through the streets by a people who were accompanied by a yelling crowd, if she was a 'petroleuse' or in days gone by, a Prussian spy.

The Jews of Paris have celebrated their Carnival, or as they call it by the Hebrew word 'Purim'—a festival of lots instituted by Mordecai to commemorate Haman's machinations against the Jews, but which were defeated by Esther. After a comminatory service in the synagogues against Haman, and the consumption of little cakes in the form of an ear, to symbolize the ears of Haman as cut off by order of Ahasuerus—a monster masked ball succeeded and was patronized by some 6,000 Israelites, of all degrees, from the old cod' merchant up to Rothschild himself, who put in an appearance for half an hour. Never was there such a collection of beautiful women, of Esthers, and no wonder the Persian King gave his heart and crown twenty three centuries ago to their ancestor. In the absence of a gibbet fifty cubits high with a Haman dangling therefrom, there was not a little of can-caning. The fancy dresses were very humorous and of a grotesque nature.
