THE MITRE MISSION. The questions between Brazil and the Argentine Republic, have given rise to the most violent expressions, on the part of the press of both countries, and rumours of war have been rife in every circle.

The Carlist movement is at an end. Marshal Serrano on the 24th ult. published an amnesty for Amoravieta in the Biscay territory, offering not only a complete pardon to all who hid down their arms, but also that all officers &c. who had passed over to the Carlists were to be restored to their former rank and position.

The pretender, Don Carlos de Borbon, after the defeat at Orotiqueta on May 4th was no more heard of and even supposed killed. It seems he had time to get on an English blood-mare at the church-door and set off at full speed, but the mare threw him, and he was picked up and conveyed insensible to the house of Count Barraud.

The Duchess of Medina-Coele, Countess of Mina, and ladies of Coruña have got up subscriptions for the wounded. The Government troops report their entire loss in the campaign as not exceeding 3 officers and 51 soldiers.

Marshal Serrano on his return to Madrid was received at the railway-station by the King, Cabinet Ministers, high civil functionaries and a crowd of friends, who congratulated him on having suppressed the rebellion with so little bloodshed.

Admiral Topeka [who acted as Premier in the absence of Serrano] declared that he and the other Ministers at once approved of the Amoravieta Convention as the wisest way of putting a stop to the revolution; Serrano who took his seat as Deputy said that he felt he had done his duty and not contravened any law, as he preferred to treat the Carlists as brothers rather than enemies.

The debate continued to-day, but will result in a large majority to approve Serrano's acts, whereupon he will take the oaths as Prime-Minister of the new Cabinet.

The Carlist leaders have telegraphed to Madrid that 5,000 of their followers have delivered up their arms to the Government authorities. The resignation of Zorrilla, chairman of the Cortes, is regarded as an ill omen; it is thought most of the Radical Senators and Deputies will also resign and leave the Cortes.
