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PROSPERITY TO BUENOS AYRES.

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"B. Ayres and the Argentine Republic are the natural Allies of England; their wealth is to be united to ours, in being united to them."

"I hope I shall never live to see any distinction between the prosperity of B. Ayres and our own."

"Our interests should be one, and the last thing that should happen should be that any differences should occur."

"Anything that happens for the good of B. Ayres and the Argentine Republic is good for us."

These are the sentiments that were uttered on May 31st of the current year at a meeting in Cannon St. London...

presided over by one of England's foremost commoners, Mr. David Robertson M.P.:

they were spoken from the chair, and met the hearty concurrence of men whose life-long careers were connected with B. Ayres, such as Messrs. Zimmermann, Gilmour, &c.

We could have imagined that this speech was delivered in Calle San Martin, so full is it of friendship for this country, of strong reliance in its destinies, of flattering promise to its inhabitants, and of cordial union of purpose between natives and foreigners.

We accept Mr. Robertson's sentiments as our own, for they are endorsed by thousands of our countrymen in this Province, whose fortunes and sympathies are inseparable from those of their adopted land, and who are proud to think, with Mr. Robertson, that no country in the world is making more rapid progress than Buenos Ayres.

We leave to other, perhaps able, pens to attempt the task of disproving Mr. Robertson's statement, of showing that the progress of B. Ayres is imaginary, and that the destinies of the country are proximate bankruptcy and wholesale ruin.

For more than ten years we have consistently maintained the onward march of the country, and the statistics of 1872, as compared with 1862, are our conclusive justification.

It is cheering to find an influential meeting of Englishmen connected with River Plate matters, in London, express themselves so kindly and hopefully of this country.

Doubly satisfactory is it to know that thousands of English, Irish and Scotch residents in B. Ayres are animated by similar sentiments.

We all see the progress of the country, we feel interested in its welfare, we are confident of its future.

That there are many and great abuses is unhappily too true, and we have never failed to point them out and demand a remedy, but it is also true that slowly and steadily the good cause of reform is going forward, and if peace be maintained for a dozen years we shall have carried out many solid works of improvement and placed the destinies of the Republic on the high-road to fortune.

If there be an Englishman or other foreigner in B. Ayres who looks on himself as the soldier of a garrison in an enemy's country; if there be any one who considers such sentiments as Mr. Robertson's unpatriotic or un-English; if there be among us those who ridicule any man that feels kindly-disposed to the country and people—far better for such an Englishman to cast his lot elsewhere, in any of the British Colonies from Natal to New Zealand.

The men who helped to make Buenos Ayres what it is were those who devoted their lives and energies to its commerce, industry and resources. They staked neither words of encouragement nor years of patient toil to carry out improvements from which in many cases the country would gain more than themselves. They were enthusiasts in their way, but their names are inscribed in the industrial annals of B. Ayres.

Britain has many such sons, whose useful lives are free from noise or vanity, and the perfume of whose good deeds lives even in their ashes.

THE FINANCE MINISTER'S REPORT, THE Census returns of 1869, the Commercial Tables furnished by Woodgate Brothers to Mr. Bateman, and

the Statesman's Year-book for 1870 are the following statistics:—

1st. Trade Returns.

Minister Dominguez shows that notwithstanding the suspension of trade for two months during the Plague, the returns for 1871 were—

Imports \$11,137,258 \$9,181,709
Exports 23,412,543 26,506,061

If to the above be added 20 per cent for the plague-interval it will be seen that our trade would show for much more—Woodgate's tables show as follows—

1868. 1869.
Imports \$18,008,759 \$7,808,654
Exports 7,793,093 7,558,938

Comparing these returns with those of 1862 we find the table thus—

Imports \$11,351,200 \$5,351,994
Exports 7,508,651 7,855,928

Here we see the gross trade of B. Ayres doubled in seven years.

If we take up the tonnage returns of the port of Buenos Ayres, we find these wonderful figures fully borne out:

1862. 1865. 1870.
Tons 341,550 512,500 1,428,627

Here we see the tonnage of our port trebled in five years; and lest you may suppose there is some mistake in the figures of 1870, we quote as follows from the Customs Report:

Steamers 790,072
Sailing vessels 78,553

Let us compare these returns with those of other ports.

From a report before us we find that Valparaiso doubles its tonnage in ten years, New York in 25 years, Bordeaux in 12, Calcutta in 13, Marseilles in 9. But none of these can compare with Buenos Ayres, which has trebled in five years!

These figures would appear incredible if not borne out simultaneously by Woodgate's tables and the Customs Returns.

Mr. Woodgate shows that our imports double in ten years, our exports in eight.

Compare this with Canada:

1861. 1865.
British exports \$3,911,276 \$7,327,777
Do. imports 6,000,000 2,265,800

Here we see little change in four years, and if we estimate the total trade of Upper and Lower Canada, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick, we find:

Imports \$41,631,929
Exports 11,914,974

In other words a population of 4,283,103 inhabitants represented a total trade of 26 millions sterling, while the Argentine Republic with 1,810,000 souls stands for 17 millions sterling, which gives an average trade per capita of—

\$5.66 per head in Canada.
And \$9.39 per head in this Republic.

A Canadian writes us that it is not the revenue but the trade of a country which shows its progress; herein we see the Argentine Republic beats Canada hollow. Let us also examine the revenues.

The Customs of Upper and Lower Canada for 1868 gave \$1,100,000, whereas the single port of B. Ayres yields from 12 to 15 millions annually. But if you include internal taxation the revenue of Canada amounts to 17 millions (this year they expect 20 millions) which is about as much as our Customs-revenue amounts to, without counting property-tax or other provincial imposts.

The Argentine Republic counts over 600 miles of railway in active traffic, whereas according to the Mercantile, Australia has 1,050 miles. We have no later returns than the Statesman's Year-book for 1870, which gives the following—

New S. Wales 150

Meantime there is at least one point in which the railways of Buenos Ayres can compare to great advantage, for they give on an average 9 per cent net profits, whereas in England the average is from 4 to 5, and in New South Wales the receipts were less by £615 in 1867, than the working expenses.

The same does not occur in any other part of the world.

Finance.

We find that the revenue, which was six millions in 1864-65, is now about eighteen millions, thus trebling in seven years.

Conclusion.

If the returns increase in the same ratio between 1872 and 1882 as in the last decade, we shall find that in ten years hence thus:

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In other words our revenue, trade, tonnage, &c. will show a similar develop-

Asuncion, July 10th, 1872. To the Editors of the STANDARD, Gentlemen, Please contradict the report which appears in your issue of the 29th ult., to the effect that I was assassinated in Asuncion.

I am, however, much pained to have to state that Mr. M. Adam, Inspector of Permanent Way of the Asuncion and Villa Rica Railway, was barbarously assassinated at the Trinidad Station on the 6th inst.

Must we continue to be indebted to the French or other Consul for assistance under these circumstances? Is England too poor to pay for a Consul to represent her in Paraguay? I send you the Asuncion papers containing the particulars of this affair. I trust the STANDARD will make use of its influence to point out the unfortunate position in which British subjects are placed in Paraguay.
