MINERAL EXPLORATION OF THE PROVINCES, AND SIXTY MINERS MATTERS.

Mineral exploration of the Provinces, and sixty miners matters, such as subsidies to churches and schools, pensions to widows and orphans, medals for the Paraguayan campaign, a vote of £2,000 for a monument over those who fell therein, regulation of tariff for light-houses, establishment of a corps of short-hand writers, new telegraph-offices opened in the provinces, new meteorological department, regulations for model-farms, Rio Bermejo navigation, medal for Dr. Eduardo Oliveira for the Cordoba Exhibition, harbor-works for Santa Fe, subsidy for mail-coaches from San Juan to Tucuman, ratification of Teguior's notes on the Cotegipe mission, donation of £500 to Sr. La Fuente as census-commissioner, payment of credits to Mr. Alfred Lamb, and other business of less note.

IMMIGRATION AND THE BUDGET

The National budget which comes on for discussion this evening contains an item of \$200,000 for Immigration, being the largest sum yet voted for this purpose. It is nevertheless a sarcasm upon the importance of such a matter to say—"We spend £10,000 a year to encourage immigration and think we have done quite enough, since free passages, farm-grants and the like are all very well in Australia and North America, but are wholly unnecessary in the River Plate."

Let us look around and see what efforts Brazil, Canada, New Zealand, Victoria, Queensland, &c. are making, to invite agricultural settlers from Europe to cultivate the lands that still lie idle and unproductive.

Brazil has made contracts during the past six months for 100,000 English, 100,000 German and 100,000 Piedmontese colonists, with Messrs. Kitto, Blumenau, Parini and others; each colonist to be allotted a small farm in Rio Grande and Santa Catalina.

Moreover the Brazilian Consuls at Hamburg and Antwerp have orders to issue tickets by the steamers at the same rate (£3) as the Bremen steamers charge for passages to New York, the Brazilian Government paying the difference; and in certain cases where the emigrant is well-recommended the Consul can give him a free passage to Rio Janeiro.

Canada, upper or lower, is a favorite field for English settlers, owing to the cheapness of passage-money, liberal land-system, and admirable administration in every particular. At the same time every Province votes large sums to encourage immigration: the Government of Quebec (which represents one-third of the Dominion) had a vote of 296,400 last year for this purpose, besides 6,400,350 acres surveyed and marked out for settlers, in free land-grants of 100 acres each for every male over 18 years of age, along the colonization roads. Cleared farms may be purchased from 5000 upwards.

New Zealand gives land-grants from 40 acres upwards and advertises in all the London papers that assisted passages will be given to agricultural laborers, female servants, and artisans. No country has gained more wonderfully by immigration than this, the trade having increased 20-fold in 15 years, and the population risen from 26,707 in 1851 to 218,668 in 1867; the immigration this last year was 11,126 souls. This little colony, at the remotest corner of the world and 1200 miles from the continent of Australia, has about the same population as our province of Coriola and sets us an example worth imitating. It is building a railway 150 miles long across the largest island, and votes £502,000 (for one sixth of its budget) for immigration, roads, and lands.

Victoria, with a revenue inferior (£2,273,000) to that of the Argentine Republic, votes £12,000 for immigration, £40,000 for subsidies to steamers, and £176,000 to the Roads and Lands office.

But why continue the list of young countries making efforts to encourage immigration? It is admitted to be also a matter of vital importance for this Republic, and we have a right to hope that Congress will this evening double the Minister's item, making it \$400,000. Suppose one-fourth of the amount goes towards paying the agents and supporting the Asilo de Inmigrantes; it would leave \$300,000 which might be given as bonuses of \$30 dollars or £6 a head to the various steamboat companies to bring out 10,000 picked emigrants yearly, the emigrants themselves paying the other £20 of the passage. Perhaps the Government of B. Ayres will then consider the expediency of asking the Provincial Legislature to buy or allot an area of 10 square leagues near Bragado or Las Flores, to be broken up into 1,000 free farm lots of 67 acres (or 16 cuadradas each) for immigrants.

THE PORONGOS JOCKEY CLUB. The anarch which reigned supreme in the Banda Oriental for two years, came happily to an end last autumn. During this time of desolation the Porongos Jockey Club, in common with many others of the institutions of the country, suffered a total eclipse. The members of the club were scattered, and their studs were seized to furnish remounts for the warriors of one or other faction; race-horses being especially sought for, and dragged out of all manner of hiding places, in defiance of the protestations of their owners. The bones of many of these poor animals lay bleaching in the sun on many a battle-field all over the country. Those which had escaped from bullets, forced marches and starvation, dried on a miserable existence, the backs of charcoeros and pedlars at all the country towns. Some few, thanks to the intervention of friendly officers, are yet preserved by their owners.

The better times animated the members of the club to venture on a spring meeting, which came off on the 17th and 18th September. The club was woefully diminished in number, and with a few exceptions, the horses were old servants of former armies. In half trained, or not trained at all, in spite of these drawbacks the meeting was very successful. The weather was magnificent, the ground in splendid condition, and the jumps in the steeple-chase course were made easy to suit the capacities of the horses. In the scratch steeple-chase there were two falls, neither of them attended with serious consequences; and in the first hurdle-race, "Firefly" bolted through a bank with his jockey, hurling him on the arm, and landing, but in none of the other races was there any accident whatever.

The chief honors of the meeting were carried off by two slashing young horses, "Winton" and "The Snob," brought by Mr. Bridger from the North of the Rio Negro, and by Mr. O'Neill's two, "Shamrock" and "First Trial," which he had succeeded in saving through the war. The best hat race of the meeting was the mile and a half, which was well contested. Mr. Maris's grey horse "Rama" made the running for himself from start to finish, but there was a hard struggle for second and third places, which were secured by "The Snob" and "Siva," with other four well up. "Oliver Twist" magnificently ridden by Mr. Short, made a hard fight of it for the two mile race, but was passed in the run in by "The Snob," and had to be content with saving his stake. The principle stake was found to be "First Trial," who bounded over the jumps like a deer, and had the best of everything on the ground. In most of the races the tailing off was fearful. In the hurdle race especially several of the horses were not over the last jump when the winner passed the post. On the Grand Stand there were more English ladies on this occasion than have ever before crowded a meeting of the Jockey Club with their presence, and the attendance of the fair sex from the town of Porongos itself was also very good.

The lines are to be all completed in five years. This measure as originally framed would seem to indicate a postponement of the Bateman port-scheme, as it was laid down that the surplus \$2 millions of the Public Works loan were to be specially devoted towards making good the guarantee on these lines, instead of sinking the same with the four millions already decreed towards carrying out the proposed port of Buenos Ayres, as suggested by Minister Dominguez; but the clause in question was struck out on the second reading.

The debate on the National Bank continues in the House of Deputies, and if this measure also be passed in to law it can hardly be said that the session was a barren one. We can afford to postpone indefinitely the project of moving the capital to Rosario, San Nicolas, or Villa Maria; indeed the idea is almost exploded, and every day brings with it fresh ties to bind the National Government to the centre of commerce and intellect in Buenos Ayres, and to convince the country-deputies that the Interior can best be benefited through Buenos Ayres. We will give the Provincian railways, banks, etc., and let them quietly resign themselves to the fact that Buenos Ayres is and must be the head of the Republic.

The Municipality, at its last sitting, discussed the advisability of doing away with that noisy and to our mind, unnecessary institution—Tramway outriders. No decision was come to, and the matter was referred back to the Committee for re-consideration. The proposal was in fact made in favour of abolishing the tramway. If the drivers are coerced to go at a slow pace the change will not be dangerous, and will prove an advantage to the public and a gain to tramway shareholders. For a month past very many cars travel without "guias," yet no increase of accidents has been reported. The experiment is worth trying, for, viewed merely as a matter of personal comfort, the trampeters are an intolerable nuisance, and their usefulness is questionable.

THE SESSION OF 1872.

The present session is in many respects the most important that the Argentine Congress has held since the re-constitution of the Republic after Pavon. The total number of measures passed into law up to yesterday was 72, and some of these are of incalculable value for the welfare and progress of the country. The list shews as follows:—

Narrow-gauge railways [1500 miles] through Interior Provinces. Postal treaties with Brazil and U. States. Standing army raised to 10,000 men. Vote of £500,000 for two ironclads. Treaties with Austria and Sweden. National railway law. Reform of postal tariff. Abolition of imprisonment for debt. Vote of £10,000 for new post-offices. Colonization grants in Chaco and Patagonia. Subsidies for cloth-mills and glass-factories.

This measure as originally framed would seem to indicate a postponement of the Bateman port-scheme, as it was laid down that the surplus \$2 millions of the Public Works loan were to be specially devoted towards making good the guarantee on these lines, instead of sinking the same with the four millions already decreed towards carrying out the proposed port of Buenos Ayres, as suggested by Minister Dominguez; but the clause in question was struck out on the second reading.

The debate on the National Bank continues in the House of Deputies, and if this measure also be passed in to law it can hardly be said that the session was a barren one. We can afford to postpone indefinitely the project of moving the capital to Rosario, San Nicolas, or Villa Maria; indeed the idea is almost exploded, and every day brings with it fresh ties to bind the National Government to the centre of commerce and intellect in Buenos Ayres, and to convince the country-deputies that the Interior can best be benefited through Buenos Ayres. We will give the Provincian railways, banks, etc., and let them quietly resign themselves to the fact that Buenos Ayres is and must be the head of the Republic.

The Municipality, at its last sitting, discussed the advisability of doing away with that noisy and to our mind, unnecessary institution—Tramway outriders.
