It is impossible to hold out to the surplus population of Europe a more inviting, and at the same time more truthful, picture. Let it be known in the towns and hamlets of Germany, or among the rural populations of Ireland or Scotland...

Cooks are, as usual at a high premium, employers offering as much as \$600 for women, and \$1,000 for men-cooks. The latter figure is equivalent to £100 a year, with board and lodging...

As an instance of how much the demand exceeds the supply in our labor we note 345 applications by estancieros, for farm-servants, last month at the Labor Office over and above the number of servants placed out. In other words, if double the number of immigrants had applied for work they would not yet suffice for the demand.

Economists will be able to explain to us the paradox that while money in Buenos Ayres has fallen to half its value in the discount market the rates of labor have notably risen. But it is not so easy to comprehend how the working-classes are able to earn more here than in Australia...

Let us admit all that is said about the poverty, ignorance, backwardness of the Interior provinces; but this is 'raison de plus' for the National Government to furnish them every advantage; while who can doubt that Buenos Ayres itself would progress infinitely more were the Interior provinces wealthy and prosperous.

With a cynical contempt for public opinion and even of Constitutional law, the Santa Fe Government has appropriated to itself almost all the municipal revenue, even at the moment that the Chambers are dissenting the Municipal Organic Law.

Two local papers are furious. The Ciudad, which is not an opposition journal, says: "After reading the above project of Law, we hardly know by what name to qualify the conduct of the Government people. It would seem that there is a deliberate intention of discrediting their own administration and rousing public opinion against themselves."

EDITORIAL TABLE. The H.M.S. Boyne and S.S. Ariadne arrive at Montevideo yesterday. The news from Europe is good. The eagles, single and double-headed, at Berlin, have failed to agree on a plan for dividing the world between them.

The river was unusually low on Sunday, and the beach dry for a couple of miles out in some directions. The day was so hot that crowds of naked 'gamins' were to be seen bathing and running races on the sand in the same costume de bain that a few weeks ago, hundreds of crabs were left high and dry in all directions near shore.

Another brutal exhibition of cruelty to animals was witnessed in Calle Rivadavia on Sunday. Two coaches came into collision the pole of one vehicle penetrating the chest of the other horse under the other. The poor animal was wounded to death, and its death was most painful to hear.

The inauguration of the Cordoba and Tucuman Railway will take place on the 15th inst. The date is destined to open a new era in the provinces, and will be, as Dan O'Connell would say, "a great day for the Interior."

The Provisional Government fortunately was prepared, and sent to recall in all haste Generals van Severen and Streber. At present there are 800 men in Comayagua.

Ex-President Medina is still at large in Honduras, with it is said between 200 and 500 men. Salvador troops and a force from Guatemala had united to go and attack Medina.
