FOREIGN RAILWAY CON- TRACTS AND THE PRICE OF RAILS. The terms on which railway con- tracts are being taken in South America would appear to be in adverse ratio to the actual state of things here, to fully the price of rails has advanced to \$21 per ton, and difficult to get at all, unless upon terms some time given out. Competition for railway works generally exceeds anything hitherto experienced, leading to the inference that contractors do not look to a continuance of present high rates; how far these calculations will be borne out remains to be seen. It is true there is a large development taking place of new iron works and new collieries in all parts of the country where the material is to be found, whilst Continental makers are extending their production, and in the United States the supply of iron and coal are unlimited so soon as an adequate amount of labour can be secured to bear on the production, which existing high prices will material- ly stimulate. It is not only rails that have increased so much in value, but locomotives and machinery of all kinds, as well as rolling stock, so that calcu- lations made twelve or even six months back, require to be materially revised. We do not of course suppose that these considerations are overlooked by con- tractors, but it is to be judged by the tenders already accepted for railways in Argentine Republic, there must be a more sanguine view of the future than seems justified by passing events. As regards the supply of coal, we append the following letter which recently ap- peared in the columns of the Financier: "Sir,—I have just returned from a short journey to North and South Wales and the Midland counties, and am anxious to give you my impression as to the position of the coal trade in those districts. There is, however, very little difference between the posi- tion of the collieries there and with us in Lancashire. Everywhere I notice the same thing, the collieries full of orders and old contracts (many of them still at very low rates), and everywhere the men more inclined for recreation than work, and determined not to allow any stocks to be put upon the banks of the pit. In fact they seem to manage matters so well that, where they manage their masters have pressing contracts, they take care to get their contracts in arrears. Under such circumstances, there is not a colliery proprietor who will enter into any new contracts, even at the present greatly enhanced prices, and the time is rapidly approach- ing when a great many industrial establishments will be stopped for want of coal, say when their present coal contracts are at an end. In many instances it has ceased to be a question of price. In some localities coal is not to be had in quantities at any price, and often when a manufacturer wants it is only as a great favour, and because he has been a good customer for many years, that 20 to 50 tons a week are given to him. As to taking on new customers, even if they come with cash in hand, no coal proprietor thinks of looking at them. This is about the real state of things in all the coal districts of England, and I believe, also of Scotland. Another thing which will aggravate matters still further is that on the 1st September the additional rate for carriage of coal and iron comes into operation over nearly all the railways. The boatmen, also, in those few districts where water carriage is still competing with the railways, have not been slow in following the example, and there are notices out from them demanding a considerable advance of wages, and if not accepted to the contrary, they will strike. How all this will end no one can tell, but, from all I have seen lately, I have come to the conclusion that there will be no change for the better on this side of Christmas, but the reverse—I am, Sir, your obedient servant.
