The duties of good and active Consuls are so severe and trying that either the office ought to be abolished "in toto" or a proper remaneration paid them. A Consul must be a a saifor and a gentleman; he must be an "Escribano Publico" and a "Sacerdote;" he must be an expert conveyancer and a sea lawyer; he must have Abbott on Shipping off by heart, from cover to cover, and be a walking in dex of Mitchell's Shipping and Commercial Register; more still he must be a historian. In denying to Consuls the mporfance which their posts command we injure an office that it is convenient to maintain; and, although the daily intercourse with sailors and sea cooks is little qualified to add to the polish of the gentlemen, still the Consuls themselves are so keenly alive to this that they take good care that the ruest of the office in nothing impairs the refinement of the gentleman.

No wonder. The following is the alarming intelgence from the stars to which we referred vesterday. It is supplied by that distinguished Irishman Dr. Pat O'Huggins, of the R.A.S. Four years ago he applied the spectroscope to the case of the bright stars Sirius, though his instrumental means were not then sufficient to render him quite certain as to the result. Still he was able to announce with some degree of confidence that Sirius is receding at a rate exceeding 20 miles per second. In order that he might extend the method to other stars, the Royal Society placed at his disposal a fine telescope, 15 inches in aperture, and specially adapted to gather as much light as possible with that aperture. Suitable spectroscopie appliances were also provided for the delicate work Dr. Huggins was to undertake. It was but last winter (says the Spectator) that the instrument was ready for work; but already Dr. Huggins has obtained the most wonderful news that the stars are travelinterveiling towards us at the rate of 50 miles per second, and as his thward motion is fully as great (for this distance has been estimated), the actual velocity with which he is speeding through space cannot be less than seventy miles per second. Other stars are moving with corresponding velocities. 
