DREAMS AND REALITIES.

The law for colonization and Govern ment of the Gran Chaco was promul gated a few days ago, and its terms are so liberal that it is likely to cause attention in Europe. Meantime all who love the progress of the Argentine Republic are bound to put the matter fairly before English readers, with its lights and shadows, that intending co. lonists may not be disappointed and give the country a bad name which it does not deserve.

That the Governor of the Chaco is to reside at Villa Occidental with a salary of £1200 a year, aided by a secretary with £500 a year, is utterly unimportant to us or to the world in general. But there are temptations held out to emigrants that we would coun sel them to resist-

"But, we hear somebody say, you forget about Villa Occidental". Not at all, and we believe the reason the Census commissioners don't give it is, because there were no inhabitants at he time. An Englishman who visited it last year said he found two dozen wood-cutters, besides some soldiers and women just sent up from Asuncion. The place was so surrounded with swamps that he could not walk far. It will be remembered that the French colonists who tried to escape from Old Lopez were caught in these swamps which are of no earthly use, except to arpinchos and alligators.

Meantime the Indians have been along the Central Argentine Railway, sweeping all before them at Tortugas, one of Mr. Wheelwright's stations which the Government used to say was not stylish enough for the locality.

The accounts of this inroad are extremely painful, though not unmixed with instances of heroism on the part of the poor settlers who are exposed to such terrible neighbours. Rio Grande, Nov 8th. Deputy Berlink's railway bill is the largest project of the kind which has yet been brought before the Chambers at Port Alegre; it embraces 7 narrowgauge lines similar to the San Leopoldo New Hamburg and Port Alegre line, now approaching completion under Messrs Sawer and Turner. These lines will sum up several hundreds of miles, in this order-
