



AMERICAN CONSULS.

The circumstance of the Washington Government having accepted the resignation of Dr. William Bertram, U. S. Consul at Montevideo, sooner than accede to the alternative of raising his salary, may, strictly speaking, be regarded as an event on which comment, much less to pass censure.

The American Government need not appoint a Consul at all in these countries unless it see fit, and therefore the an aristocaatic matrimonial alliance, persons it may appoint, or the salaries awarded them, are entirely at the discretion of the Foreign Affairs Secretary at Washington.

Nevertheless, we venture to make ome remarks on this subject, not so very ill-judged economy, as to give Mr. Secretary Fish a little information of which he is possibly ignorant.

The River Plate Republics, according to well based estimates and official statistics, are by far the most progress ive portion of South America. The sympathies of the people incline more towards Americans and their institutions than to those of Europe; yet the United States take little pains to cultivate reciprocal relations with them. The city of Buenos Ayres is pretty much on a level with Boston in every particular, and Montevideo may be compared in population and importance to the port of Antwerp, among European cities: yet there is no American Minister in either of the cities of La Plata, and the Consul in M.Video is forced to write to his Government: resign."

Let us for a moment consider the absurdity of asking a man with a family (or even if he had no family) to tions. AERERE VER live on \$83 a month and serve his country with zeal and diligence.

Why, the assistant-cook at any of the hotels gets as much salary, besides food and run of the house gratis; while a poor Consul must starve and be content to have an eagle with E Pluribus Unum over his door. It would be easy to shew that even double Dr. Bertram's salary would ill suffice to keep the wolf from the door in these expensive latitudes, and then a Consul has no privilege against imprisonment for debt, but may be put up by his butcher or baker in the same way

as any other man: When Dr. Bertram was appointed Consul at Montevideo in reward for having one of his arms shattered in the war, he had possibly golden visions of settling down with his young family in some place like Teneriffe or the Azores, where we are told a gentleman can maintain a nice establishment on 500 dollars a year.

"Oh. Had we some bright little isle of our own."

No wonder the Canaries are called the Fortunate Isles since any man without a fortune can live there in affluence.

But Dr. Bertram soon found, like Sancho Panza, that "Estas aventuras no son de insulas




