TUCUMAN RAILWAY WORKS.

The National Government under date January 28th. approved of the plans of Messrs. Telfener and Lumb for the construction of the Cordoba and Tucuman Railway, and although the details of sectional earthworks and bridges are dry and uninteresting for any but scientific readers, it is pleasant to see with what activity this enterprise will be prosecuted simultaneously on different parts of the line.

The total length, say 400 miles, is divided into 4 great sections, and the progress of the works will follow the subjoined programme—

1st. Cordoba to Barrancas.

Surveys to be completed by February, 1873, and then pioneers employed to clear the track, after which three large gangs of navvies will begin the earthworks simultaneously at Cordoba, Sinsacate, and Paso de Pozos.

At the last-named point there will be much engineering labour, in cuttings and embankments, which will take two months extra. The five iron bridges for this section, ordered last October, are to arrive by April, and the rails will begin arriving from June, until October.

The machinery and rolling stock may be looked for by November, and the line may be opened to traffic by the Government in April of 1874.

2nd. Barrancas to Acreo.

Surveys completed by August, 1873, pioneers clearing the route. Bridge of 400 feet to arrive from England by December. Navvies to begin earthworks in April, 1874; and as the rails will have already arrived from England, and the waggons of the first section will bring up material as the earthworks advance, the whole of the permanent way on this section will be fully laid by the close of 1874, and the section may be opened to public traffic by January, 1875.

3rd. Acreo to Cañias.

Surveys completed by Feb., 1874, and two large bodies of workmen commence simultaneously in March at the 275th and 345th kilometre, so as to finish the earthworks early in 1875. Two iron bridges for this section will be ordered, to arrive by April, 1874, and the rails, by January, 1875. All these orders are on a basis of six months from date of giving sanction in England; but in case of disaster by sea, or similar delay, there is still sufficient time to allow the orders to be repeated without seriously retarding operations. The laying of rails on this section will take from January to October, and the line may be opened to traffic as far as Cañias by November, 1875.

4th. Cañias to Tucuman.

Surveys completed by August, 1874, but two large gangs of navvies will have been already set to work at kilometres 385 and 405, during the construction of the last-named section. The cuttings and embankments will entail great labour, and as the principal feature will be the crossing of numerous water-courses and arroyos, it is arranged that 11 iron bridges will be sent out from England, to arrive by the end of 1874. The rails will arrive by August, 1875, and it is calculated that by 12 months from that date the section will be entirely completed, and the line finished to Tucuman, and ready for public traffic by August, 1876.

The opening of the several sections to public traffic may, therefore, be looked for in this order— Cordoba to Barrancas, April, 1874. Do. to Cañias, November, 1875. Do. to Tucuman, August, 1876.

The station and workshops at Cordoba will be commenced at once, as the Inspecting Engineer promised the plans by the end of February. The wayside stations, watchmen's huts, &c. along the line as each section advances. The telegraph wires to be commenced in January, 1874; and the Tucuman terminus about the middle of 1875, when the workshop machinery arrives.

Mr. Lindmark, head of the National Engineering Department, in his remarks dated January 25th on the above outline of works, suggests that the constructors should have proposed to lay down the rails on the 1st and 2nd sections simultaneously, to facilitate the earthworks at Salinas on section 3rd, and the better to finish the whole line to Tucuman within the 4 years of concession. He admits, however, that such proceeding would entail an extra outlay of 80,000 hard dollars, and, as Messrs. Telfener & Co. promise to finish the line in the 4 years, after their own fashion, thinks the Government is safe in ratifying the said programme.

Messrs. Telfener & Co. observe, in parenthesis, that the above programme contemplates the full period of 4 years, but that they expect to make the various sections in less time than specified, and thus earn the bonus of £5,000 a month (if we rightly remember the figure) for such saving of time as they may accomplish in opening the line to public traffic under the period of 4 years.

The enterprise is in workmanlike hands, and has the best wishes of everybody in the Argentine Republic.

Land in the far South is also looking up. The latest bargain is the purchase of five leagues in one lot, by a European mercantile house.

A SAD TALE OF SHIPWRECK.

The following is the narrative of Mr. John Saville, first mate of the American ship Golden Hind, wrecked on the coast of Patagonia, in June last, on the voyage from New York for San Francisco. The ship met with very bad weather when off the Patagonian coast, and lost her rudder at the entrance of the Straits of Magellan. A temporary rudder was made, but it was carried away two days afterwards, and after drifting helplessly, the ship struck on the rocks. Mr. Saville says:

Three boats were hurriedly prepared, the men put on extra suits of clothes, laid in a small quantity of provisions, and at seven o'clock that evening I started. In the hurry of departure, nearly all our nautical instruments were left on board, and, in fact, my articles of clothing were very scanty. There were three boats lowered, the first under the command of Captain Robbins, the second commanded by myself, and the third in charge of Mr. Webb, the second mate. Each contained several men. Mr. Webb, asserting that he knew the situation better than we did, parted company almost immediately, and it being then quite dark, we lay under the lee of the land until morning.

The sea at the time we left the ship was breaking over her bows, and during the night she beat to pieces on the rocks. The next morning the last vestige of the Golden Hind had disappeared, and a search, which continued two days, was made for the other boat, but no trace of her could be seen. We had long before this concluded that she was swamped, and that her entire crew were drowned. Upon examination, it was found that we had a small boat and eight of her men, the latter soaked with sea water, about 200 cats of beef, and a little tea and coffee. An allowance of one cracker to each man and one can of beef to 14 was at first issued, but this speedily decreased to half a cracker, and finally we did not taste meat more than once a week. A few days after we left the wreck the captain's boat was swamped, and we lost our compass, the only instrument we had, and a quantity of provisions.

An attempt was made to reach Sandy Point, a Chilean convict settlement, and the sailing station of the Pacific mail steamers, about two-thirds the way through the Straits of Magellan, but our course could only be determined by the sun and stars. It was then mid-winter, the mountains along the coast were covered with snow and ice, and the mercury must have been several degrees below zero. We pulled close to land, working all night in fair weather, and, at length, a heavy blow, landing, and going into camp. There were plenty of scrub trees along the coast; and, as we were provided with two hatchets and a good supply of matches, a fire was always to be procured. During these visits we secured a good supply of shell fish, resembling the mussel, but we found that this diet brought on constipation, and the entire party became very unwell. For about 20 days the men held out admirably, but in the bitter cold a number were frost-bitten, and our legs and feet were terribly swollen. City Sewage and Water Works

The Committee engaged with the Sewage and Water Works of the City of Buenos Ayres have resolved, as amended by law of September 26, 1872, to call for tenders under the following conditions:
