THURSDAY, APRIL 3, 1873. PATAGONIA AGAIN.

Since the appearance of our previous article on the Chilean pretensions to the possession of Patagonia, a serious cabinet council has been brooding over the matter, and the result seems to be indicated by some military preparations going on in that direction.

seeing that the whole country around is the same as what she found at Sandy Point when starting a penal settlement there.

understanding with the government, would be an invulnerable barrier against Chilean encroachments, without arousing the enmity of two sister republics, nor occasion the spilling of that fraternal blood which flowed on the same side at Chacabuco and Talcahuano.

Since the above was penned we have had news that Chile has actually planted a settlement on the river Gallegos, thus boldly grasping the whole Straits of Magellan. This is an important stroke; still we do not despair of seeing the affair amicably arranged in another way.

Under the name of revolution, the revolutionists, and the station-master for Paraguay managed to escape on horseback, and by using the name of Gen. Caballero at Itaguá obtained a fresh horse from the revolutionary party there, and so brought the news into Asuncion in 4 hours—15 leagues.

On the 23rd the Government sent out about 300 men under the command of Minister Ferreira, who returned on the 25th with about 50 prisoners in the same train which had been captured by the revolutionists, and after having dispersed Caballero's forces, which according to some versions of the affair consisted of only 3 or 400 men, badly armed, and a band of music.

Business was exceedingly dull in Asuncion. Paper money had fallen as low as 45 dis., but had slightly improved and was at 40 when the Venezuela left.

Several Englishmen of means have invested considerable capital in that province as sheep or cattle farmers: until the revolution, they had some prospect of success; but since that time, on the plea of requisitions, their property has been plundered and destroyed, alike by the Government troops and rebels, without the slightest hope of redress.

On the Rivers Naposta and Sauce Grande, at the southern extremity of the province of Buenos Ayres, and in the neighbourhood of the port of Bahia Blanca, several British subjects are located on lands obtained from the Provisional Government.

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From so much military presumption we return to our advised policy of non-intervention. Now, Santa Cruz is easily settled; not certainly by fish factories nor Indian pulperias, but by cattle-farmers, sheep farmers, wheat growers, and a sprinkling of miners; the camps are good, the Indians are few, timid, and not predatory; the rain is more plentiful than further north, whilst all around the geological formations are so varied that something payable must be hidden therein. What a farce to think that many leagues of this advantageous land have long since been ceded to somebody or other, and not a chieftain on it yet!
