We have, therefore, before us the prospect of a surplus of four millions, of which all but threequarters of a million would be absorbed by the sum awarded to America. Among the great features of the year is the enormous Government balance at the Bank, which amounted the other day to the unprecedented figure of £12,214,448. The wisdom of the policy which dictates this accumulation may be questioned; but it is a magnificent total.

Indeed, excluding the vast increase of the pensioned class, the chief change in Germany since the close of the war has been a rise in prices. The results of the recent transfer of gold from France to Germany up to this date have been curiously like, though, of course, on a smaller scale, to those witnessed in Australia and California after the gold discoveries. Rents and prices have generally risen. There has also set in an agitation for higher wages in consequence of the rise in the expenses of the working classes. We may also mention—and it is a curious and paradoxical result of the payments to Germany-that the circulation of Bank notes has greatly increased. 


