"Our consuls have made known to the Government the deplorable picture of thousands of Italians who abandon their country in this way, and it is the duty of the Government to put inte execution all the means it possesses to prevent an immoral traffic of agencies and an illegal emigration. Everything calls for the Government to take in this matter energetic measures; the law first, and to make it respected; to pun si fraud and further commiseration for a class of unhappy citizens; to maintain public decorum: to satisfy public opinion, as well as to avoid the grave embarrassment of which they are the source to the consular agents in the protection of poor abandoned emigrants, and the considerable expense which the State has to bear in order to succour and bring them home.

"The Minister therefore addresses himself to the Prefects, and recommends them to give the most precise and rigorous instructions in order to prevent and denounce, in case of need, to the competent authorities, the immoral speculation of the emigrant agents and their illicitarafic, and, in order that they may regulate lawful emigration, they should take for their basis the following regulations,"

"Here follows a string of regulations, some of a most restrictive character, the effect of which must be to put a stop altogether to free emigration, compassing it round with difficulties and official, formalities not easily got over.

"How the Italians will like this 'stopper' on their proceedings remains to be seen. It is clear the government do not wish their country to be depopulated, or to lose thousands of useful labourers, who may be wanted to till the soil, or to serve as ! food for powder' when occasion calls for it, as we noticed in our last number. A defect in this elaborate document is that no particulars of facts are given to substantiate the assertions made as to the treatment of Italian emigrants in South America, or to what particular part of it the complaints apply. The only country to which there has been a large Italian emigration is the Argentine Republic, and that emigration is both unpurchased and spontaneous. If we may judge by the accounts given in the local journals of the River Plate, the emigrants not only find a ready, but a . remunerative demand for their labour there, thousands of them becoming permanent settlers, and many returning to their native country with money in their pockets. 
