The Poitou's Mails.

The magnificent steamer Poitou, of the famed Bonnemason line, entered port yesterday morning with European papers (Gibraltar) to the 17th April, from which we extract the following. This steamer brings a goodly number of emigrants from France, Italy, and Spain, the line being first in the esti mation of the emigrating classes from Southern Europe.

L Gibraltar, April 17th. It is to be feared that the disturb ances in Spain have again severed our communications, as no London or French papers have reached us, but only those of Madrid and Cadiz.

The Spanish papers publish a state ment that the effort to raise an army of volunteers has been a ridiculous tailure. Out of the 50,000 volunteers to be raised in 80 battalions not more than 500 have yet been enlisted.

A rumor is current that in Lerida in encounter had taken place between two regiments of the army, one of them in a state of insubordination.

The Gazette publishes intelligence from three provinces, in each of which the troops have been successful against

In Aragon, a column of volunteers under the command of their Captain were attacked at night by the united factions of Polo, Ferrer and Forcall, with about 200 men. 
