

QUARANTINE BARBARITIES.

The report submitted to the Monte videan Government respecting the condition of Flores Island lazzaretto is deplorable in the extreme, and makes the reader wonder whether this is really the 19th century. We shall not follow the Siglo through the sickening details. which have induced President Ellauri to send Colonel Somebody on a special mission to the wretched island. Suffice it to say that even at a distance of ten miles the lazzaretto smells in the noses of the citizens of Montevideo. It is a cruel sarcasm to call such a place a sanitary institution, for if the Report percorrect it is a wonder some plague of a malignant type has not broken out there and carried off the luckless ammigrants. There has been indeed one precaution taken, namely to nail up those offices which had become intole rably offensive; but as the cooking de partment is still said to suffer from contiguity to the above we can have an idea of the nausea which the poor people must feel in being forced to partake of food prepared under such conditions. It is only three months since Messrs. Eduardo Flores and Ma gariños Cervantes, on their arrival from Europe, published a fearful description of the State of Flores Island, and the clamor then raised was followed by measures which promised a salutary and sweeping reform. Alas for the instability of Oriental improve ments; here we are in May and the lazzaretto in question seems worse than it was in January. The special commissioner now sent to study the anclean matter wi'l doubtless draw up a report, the Government will likely
