While the pleasing intelligence reaches us of the Bank rate in England having fallen to 3 1/2 the Montevideo Government and Legislature are arranging the terms upon which London capitalists will be invited to celebrate a second Uruguay loan, the amount this time to be \$5,000,000 sterling, or 26,320,000 hard dollars.

LONDON LETTER.

(From our Own Correspondent.) August 7th. An extraordinary meeting of the City of Buenos Ayres Tramway Company (limited), was held this afternoon. A resolution was passed approving of a conditional agreement entered into by the directors for the purchase of the tramway belonging to Mr. Mendez, for the sum of £135,300.

WEST COAST MAILS.

REVOLUTION IN PERU. Valparaiso, Aug. 18th. The storm last week did much damage in the departments, and advices from Reingo mention subterranean noises in the Cordillera accompanied by floods.

LETTER FROM SANTA FE.

August 30th, 1873. Much that is beautiful or striking in nature or art owes its charm to the effect of contrast. The simple chalet in a retired Swiss valley would not of itself attract attention, were it not that the peaceful character of the lovely dwelling, embosomed in an orchard of cherry-trees, and surrounded by green meadows, through which flow sparkling streams, is thrown into bold relief by a background of rugged mountains, with their snow-clad tops, so that the beholder cannot without difficulty withdraw his admiring gaze from a scene where simplicity and grandeur are blended in one harmonious whole.

EDITOR'S TABLE.

Another triumph of the National arms in Entre Rios was announced yesterday morning by bell, bulletin and rocket. This time it is to the countrymen of Mr. Fulton Mendez honour is due, the Correntino forces under General Vedia's able command having completely demolished the rebels under Ocampos at India Muerta. Querecino Lescano and other Jondante leaders joined Ocampos in the fray and their hordes shared the whipping. It will be a queer thing if, with the several victories of the past week or so, the war in Entre Rios is not speedily wound up by the National commanders.

NOTICE.

The death of General Conesa was announced yesterday. The gallant veteran was one of the most distinguished officers in the Army list, and much esteemed by foreigners as well as his own countrymen. The funeral yesterday was attended by a large concourse of citizens of all ranks, including the Cabinet ministers. Deceased had been ailing for seven or eight years, and his ill-health was usually ascribed to a spent ball which struck him in the region of the heart, in a brush with the Paraguayans at Paso la Patria.

FALSE ECONOMIES. Sept. 4th, 1873. To the Editors of the STANDARD. Gentlemen,

Having been unsuccessful in obtaining the publication of the following in the Daily News, I shall feel much obliged if you will afford it space in your columns.

I am emboldened to make this request as the matter in question is one of direct public interest.

In yesterday's issue of the Daily News I notice an article referring to the National Telegraph, in which the writer of an article in the Prensa is reproved for interfering in a personal matter between that newspaper and the head of the National Telegraph Department.

As I happen to have contributed an article to the Prensa in support of the views taken by Z of this matter, I profit by this opportunity of again bringing before the public a few figures and observations on the subject through these columns, leaving to Z the task, which he will presumably undertake, of justifying himself from those at tacks in the accustomed field of his literary labours, the editorial columns of the Prensa.

The basis of the article is, that Congress keeps the Telegraphic Department in an inefficient state through misplaced economy, having refused the further grants asked for by the Executive.

It seems to me superfluous to consider what has been asked for and refused, when a glance at what has been "granted" shows us that, far from being dealt with in a niggardly manner, the Telegraph Department has had its wants lavishly supplied.

For this purpose I refer to the "Presupuesto Nacional" for 1873, which informs us of the exact amount voted for each office during the present year.

It is evident that we have only to compare these figures with the actual necessities of the service as demonstrated by the amount of work done, to arrive at once at a just conclusion.

Referring to the San Martin office, we find that there are eight messengers allowed for the delivery of the telegrams received there, or one messenger for somewhere under ten telegrams a day, as in all last month these amounted only to 2,190; and yet we are called upon to credit that these poor fellows are run off their legs with the press of business!

In the same office we find eight telegraphists allowed, the average daily work for each one last month having consisted of the despatching or receiving of eighteen telegrams, considerably less than one of them could do in an hour! In one word, we find a monthly allowance for salaries in that office of 965 patacones, whilst the total value of the telegrams despatched from there last month may be estimated at 700

patacones, if we take as our guide the average value per telegram for the whole of last year.

Let us now consider the office of Villa Maria. Here we find a really startling instance of the very rarest economy, as there are no less than four telegraphists to attend to one instrument, which gets through an average of twenty telegrams daily. This gives us two hundred and sixty patacones a month paid in salaries to do the work of an office whose average monthly receipts amount to fifty-seven patacones.

So as not to tire the patience of my readers, I refrain from producing at present any further examples, more especially as I may require them later on, as the Daily News leader promises us some statistical information on the subject.

I need not apologise for having reproduced here some data from my previous article in the Prensa; the facts mentioned are important enough to justify it.
