The undersigned German inhabitants of Cartagena feel it their duty to return their sincerest thanks to Captain Werner, the gallant commander of the German man-of-war Friedrich Carl. Actuated by this sentiment, and also in order to correct erroneous accounts of recent events, they have determined to publish the following accurate and truthful statement of an affair which reflects the highest honour upon the German navy...

On the evening of the 22nd of July, when on the point of sailing from Alicante to Cartagena to protect the German men there from any injury that might be inflicted upon them by insurgents, Captain Werner received the decree of the Madrid Government which decrea...
