that forms a navigable highway to three of our most distant provinces. More than this, the Paraguayans admit our title to all the Chaco from the Bermejo up to the Pilcomayo, over a hundred miles in length.

Perhaps we should not be far astray in saying, that the real bone of contention is Villa Occidental, formerly known as New Bordeaux, where Lopez once established a colony of Frenchmen, and where General Vedia plucked the Argentine colors last year in obedience to his Government.

A few wood-cutters have now settled down there, under Gen. Vedia's flag, but it can never be a place of any importance except as a thorn in the side of Paraguay, being nearly in front of Asuncion.

From all the antecedents we find that the Pilcomayo is claimed by the three republics, so that, even supposing we never have a triangular duel on the question, it will be extremely difficult to come to an arrangement, unless by arbitration.

But then the idea suggests itself—Is this a wise policy? If our claim to the Pilcomayo territory northward be a doubtful one, the world will say we hold possession of land we have no title to.

Nothing can be more cheering than the returns of this line, if we are to judge by those published in the Boletin Oficial of yesterday, which show a net profit of more than 6 per cent. per annum on a capital of £1,000,000 sterling.

Under the head of 'passengers' we do not include 805 soldiers carried for Government. The number of passengers was 5765, or 190 per day, Rosario standing for one-third and being exactly double the number of Cordoba, although the receipts for passenger tickets were alike, namely, one-third at Rosario, one-third at Cordoba and one-third at way-side stations.

Goods traffic represents two-thirds of the gross receipts, and weighs 160 tons daily. This does not include railway iron, in which a considerable traffic was done in 1872; but for a decline of 8335 under this head for May of the current year we should find the gross receipts giving an increase of 17,949, or 25 per cent., over those of May, 1872.

It is remarkable that the goods' traffic at Cordoba is more than half the sum total, while Rosario is a little over a quarter; this would seem to indicate that the export trade towards the sea-board is exactly double what the imports inland amount to.

The month's receipts were—£16,106 sterling, from which we have to deduct one-half for working expenses:

this leaves £8,053 net profit, equal to a dividend of 6 per cent. per annum on the cost of the line, £1,600,000 sterling. Moreover, the month of May is not one of the busiest in the year, so that, all things considered, we are inclined to think Minister Dominguez is right in his statement in the year's budget, that the time for paying guarantee on the Central Argentine is almost of the past, the line now earning close on the 7 per cent. desired by shareholders.

BURTON ON TELEGRAPHY. The Inspector General of Telegraphs has just published a luminous and interesting report in reply to the Prime Minister, showing in the most unquestionable manner that this Department is conducted with much greater economy than in England, Brazil, Russia, Italy and other countries.

Perhaps you will think telegraph clerks have much harder work in England than here, yet the proportion of messages yearly to each office in England is only 1931, whereas here it is 5508. They have an army of 16,000 clerks in England, who despatch 666 messages per head; whereas here, with a battalion of 150 all told, we can show 1211 messages each.

St. Patrick's Society. On Thursday evening, the twenty-fifth ordinary meeting of this society was held—Mr. T. ARMSTRONG in the chair.

The General told him, just before he left some 70 English colonists had arrived at Asuncion from the colony in the greatest state of destitution; that due to the Italian Consul, these poor people were supplied with food and lodging; that the poor people at the colony are suffering the greatest hardship, misery and want, and that the Paraguayan Government would offer no opposition whatsoever to their leaving Paraguay; that he considered the total number to be brought down would be about 500 as many had found situations and employment in and about Asuncion, and that he considered 5000 pats. would be quite enough to bring them down here.

General Mitre regretted that he was unable to go to-night in person to the meeting to explain all these matters, but his house was full of friends,

and it was impossible; he was delighted to see the action the St. Patrick's Society had taken in the matter—a society he was proud to be a member of, and a society which he considered calculated to work great good for his country.

The Chairman directed the secretary to write to Mr. Moran, and refer him to the Italian consul of Asuncion, who held full powers and funds. The Secretary announced that the subscription of the St. Patrick's Society for the relief of the English colonists in Paraguay was published in the papers at £150, but he was happy to say that it amounted to £170 12s., and which sum was deposited in bank.

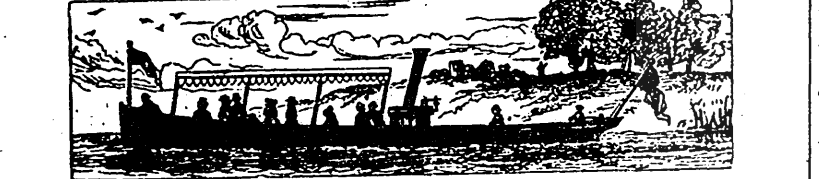
