ANOTHER CHACO COLONY.

Messrs. Burckhardt & Co. were before Congress on Tuesday with reference to a pretty large slice of the Gran Chaco which they seem to have purchased from the National Government subject to the approval of the Legislature.

The site has similar advantages to the Alexandria colony, being some where between Corrientes and Goya, on the Chaco side, with a frontage of 30 miles on the River Parana, and therefore possessing every facility for conveyance of produce.

The first batch of settlers, to comprise at least 100 families, must be brought out within 12 months after the ground has been measured and the survey approved by Government.

It does not appear from what part of Europe the contractors intend to bring the settlers, but we may suppose from the name that it will be either Germany or Switzerland. Neither are we aware of the description of country or character of the soil where the colony is to be placed.

No doubt Messrs. Burckhardt will take good care against a similar catastrophe, and under skillful management there is no reason why the colony should not thrive as well as that of Messrs. Thomson Bonar, which had a painful occurrence at the outset.

The Port-captain of Montevideo created a widespread sensation among the commanders and officers of the various naval stations, last month, by a circular ordering them to withdraw the gunboats and small war-vessels from the port and cause them to lie off the Cerro, on the grounds that such vessels were at any moment liable to blow up, from having gunpowder on board.

Thus the matter now stands, pending the arrival of the buoys. They forget that British Lords of Admiralty are made out of members of Parliament who never learned to box the compass.

The new French steamer, l'Escolle du Chili, of Messrs. German Brothers' line, is expected. The P. S. N. Co.'s R. Don Uldaricio Prado has been appointed Rector of the National Institute. The new rector is said to be a man of liberal ideas; nevertheless, his appointment has been received very coolly by the liberal press.

At a meeting of the Council of State held on the 27th instant, the decision of the Council on the claim of the Pacific Steam Navigation Company to be exempted from light house and tonnage dues, and to be refunded all monies paid on account of those dues, was agreed to, and the Minister of Justice was charged with the duty of drawing up the sentence.

IMPORTANT FROM PARAGUAY. Dates from Asuncion are to September 10th. The Paraguay mentions that the condition of the English colonists who arrived from Ytu was so deplorable that the citizens took them into their houses to relieve them.

EDITOR'S TABLE. The P.S.N.O. fine steamship Cotopaxi arrived at Montevideo on Tuesday evening after a fearfully rough and perilous passage from Valparaiso. The news from Chile is not important. A deep gloom fell over town when it became known that not a word had been heard as to the fate of the missing Patagonia. If she had found shelter in any of the ports between Valparaiso and the Mount her commander would have found means to send the news to Sandy Point; but nothing whatever was known of her there, and the inference is too sad to dwell on. Still vessels have often turned up after being given up for lost, and we yet fervently hope for the Patagonia's safety.

To balance the foregoing distressing news we have tip-top tidings from Rio where His Majesty Dom Pedro had received the Inauguration telegram of the line from Para to Pernambuco. The STANDARD received long ago the first wire on the Ohuy section of the European Cable to Montevideo, therefore we may say the Press has beaten the Crown in the telegram way, which is a remarkable sign of the telegraphic times.

We have been requested by an eminent mercantile subscriber to suggest to the amiable agents of the Ryde and Deutsche-Dampf-Schiffersgesellschaft a line of steamers that it would be a great boon to the commercial community if they would lend their valuable assistance towards despatching a mail bag to Chile by their vessels. The polite Post Office authorities were quite willing yesterday to despatch a mail to Valparaiso by the Santiago, but owing to the notice as to the hour of her sailing being rather vague, it was

impossible to do so. However, next month we have no doubt that the agents will arrange the matter for their steamers calling here.

We had the pleasure of a visit yesterday from our highly esteemed friend Sir Narváez-gauge Robertson, K.C. C. E., who has just returned from the Chaco, where he has made some important surveys for the National Government.

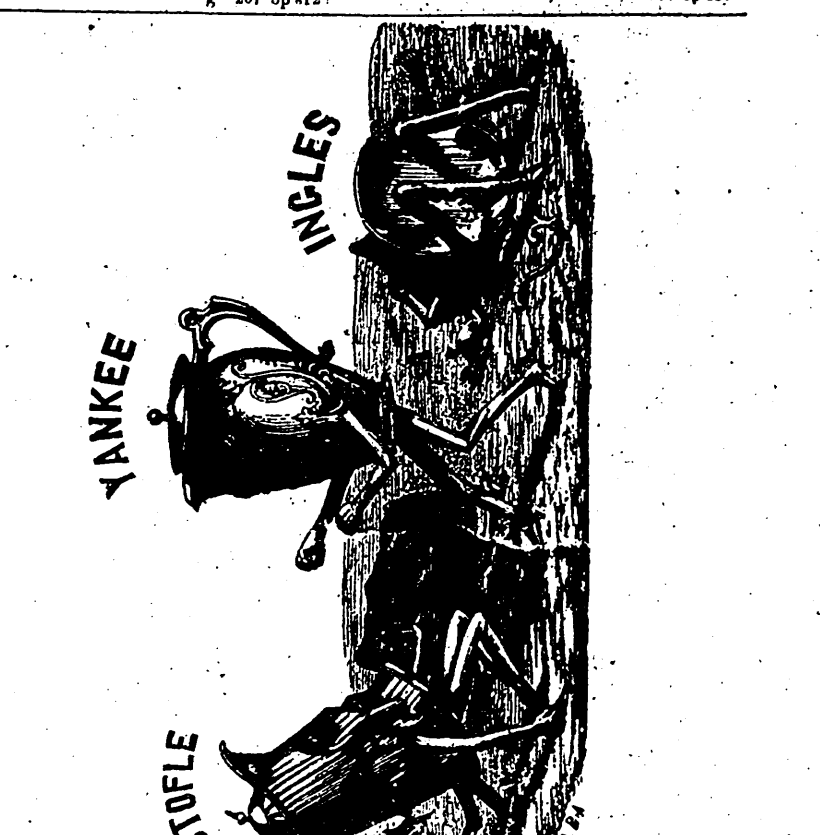
