The Islay Mails

LATEST FROM EUROPE.

Lisbon, Aug. 27th.

The rumor is again current that Bismarck intends to push the project of placing a Hohenzollern prince on the throne of Spain.

For this purpose he is said to be consulting the views of the other European Powers, except France; and the Roman papers mention that Victor Emmanuel and his Government are in favor of the project, on the understanding that the new King of Spain recognize the right of the Italian Government to hold Rome against the Pope.

It is generally believed that the Carlists find much support in France, and that if Don Carlos or any other Bourbon ascend the throne in Spain or in France, the question of the Temporal power of the Pope will be revived with widespread complications.

The restoration of Metz to France is stated by London papers to be more than likely, as the Emperor William would in this manner strengthen the position of the new King of France, Henry the Fifth, to whom the German Government would cede that important stronghold, nominally in exchange for some island of the French colonial possessions.

The National Assembly shows a large majority in favor of monarchy; one estimate gives 350 for the Count de Chambord against 270 Republicans.

Another says that the Orleanist fusion gives 440 for the new King against the above number of Republicans.

Some think MacMahon will be directed by the Assembly to proclaim the Count de Chambord as Henry V.; others, that he will hand over the Government pro tem. to the Count of Paris, until the new King ascend the throne.

Prince Arthur narrowly escaped drowning at Trouville, in Normandy being saved by his swimming master.

Lord Wolverton, head of the house of Glyn, Mills & Co. bankers, died leaving property worth over a million sterling, of which he leaves 200,000 to each of his sons in the firm.

Mr. Monsell has resigned the Post-office, but continues pro tem. Bank rate continues at 3 per cent.

Subsequently the Times and other papers contradict the rumor of restoring Metz, adding that if even the Emperor William were so generous it is very doubtful if Bismarck and Germany would listen to such a proposal.

The great Chancellor has gone to his estates at Varzin, whence he will return to Berlin next month, and afterwards make his visit to Vienna.

He is said to have told the English Ambassador, at a recent dinner, that MacMahon and the Jesuits would plunge France in an abyss; to which the other agreed, declaring that the only man who could save France was Thiers.

The reception given to the ex-President when passing through Belfort, en route for Switzerland, was most enthusiastic; the moment he was recognized, although travelling incog., he was accompanied by crowds waving banners, with cries of "Vive Thiers, our Liberator."

A similar ovation will be given him at Verdun, if he pass that way on his return.

The Duc de Broglie, MacMahon's prime minister, made a speech at a banquet in Lyons declaring the struggle now was to be one of life or death between radicalism and order.

It is supposed the Napoleon party will bring in a proposal to extend MacMahon's term of office.

The Archbishop of Posen continues to protest against the new laws against Roman Catholics.

The Emperor William addressed an order of the day to General Manteuffel, thanking the army of occupation for their discipline while in France.

It is proposed to double the police forces in the towns of Alsace, owing to the constant alterations with the peasantry.

The crisis at Posen was from over-speculation; 4 banks smashed and 100 capitalists involved.

Cholera continues in Austria and Hungary, as well as in Transylvania and Moldavia; about 60 per cent of the cases prove fatal.

The physicians sent by Government to Pesth and other towns are insufficient; and in some places the ravages are so dreadful that the crops are rotting in the fields because there are no hands to reap them.

The Emperor Francis Joseph after his conference with Emperor William at Gastein will proceed to St. Petersburg.

Cholera has also shown itself at Geneva, Milan, Turin, Venice, Piacenza, Mantua and other places in Northern Italy, partly caused, as is believed, by the excessive heat of the last month.

As yet it has not gone south of Bologna, although much uneasiness prevails at Florence, Rome and Naples, since railway communication facilitates its spread.

There have been several earthquakes, especially at Belluno, where part of the cathedral and some factories fell down.

Count de Croÿ, French Chargé d'Affaires, arrived at the Vatican with a letter from Mme. MacMahon to the Pope, and several others from the French Bishops.

A serious conflict arose between Sweden and Denmark about the Sound straits, but it has been amicably settled by allowing the pilots of each flag to work in their own waters.

The Russian army in Khiva continues in good health.

A batch of 500 liberated slaves set out for Persia on July 15th.

Two of the Khan's leading vassals have been sent as hostages to Kasalinsk.

Affairs in Spain are rather worse. The Carlists attacked Estella with great vigor, and captured it.

The news at first caused great sensation at Madrid, until the Government declared it was an insignificant place, the garrison not exceeding 150 men.

Gen. Sanchez Bregua is marching to recover Estella, but the Carlists have meantime taken and burned Tordella in Catalonia, sparing only the church, in which the garrison found asylum and did not surrender.

Cartagena still holds out in favor of the Communists.

All the Consuls have left the town. General Martinez has not force enough to take the place, and things look gloomy.

General Callero arrived at Madrid. Castelar was elected by 143 votes against 73, as President of Congress, and made a conservative speech.

Gil Bergeas was chosen Vice-President.

The Communist Rauc is to be tried on Sept. 14th.

The Shah and Sultan have agreed on settling their difficulties; the former left for Persia.

The notorious swindler who calls himself Lord Gordon was captured in Canada by two American detectives named Hay and Keegan, who were conveying him back to the U. States when the Canadian authorities rescued him and put his captors in prison.

It appears Lord Gordon, after a long and successful career of fraud in England and N. America, was accused before the U. States courts and released on bail.

Having escaped to Canada his bail Mr. Robert pursued him, and the New York Herald advances the strange theory that a bail has a right to seize a fugitive in any part of the world.

Messrs. Hay and Keegan are kept close in Fort Garry, pending their trial.

Lord Gordon complains of the arrest as an outrage unparalleled in history.

The Duke of Brunswick died at Geneva, aged 69, leaving £40,000 to an Englishman named Smith, and a million sterling to the city of Geneva.

Professor Coxwell writes about Mr. Wise's proposed balloon-trip from America to England, and complains that his countrymen never encourage him in a similar project.

He says Mr. Green, the aeronaut, offered to make the trip in 1840; but thinks Professor Wise gives ten times the buoyancy to his balloon that it will be really found to possess.

Baron Mada's Brazilian cable left Lisbon on the 21st. The shore end having been safely landed, and is now paying out all right towards Madeira.

Respecting the Autumn Manœuvres the Times says—

"It cannot, we fear, be said that this year they have proved successful. The ground, at any rate, at Dartmoor was ill chosen, and the weather has been unpropitious throughout.

On a fine day Dartmoor is delightful. No country in England could promise, to all appearances, a better field for military operations, and when it was first surveyed the Inspectors were charmed with it.

Unfortunately, just as the troops got into camp the rains set in, and the plans of the Generals were frustrated.

Something was to be learnt from the hardships experienced, and cooking victuals, for instance, with wet wood in a deluge of rain might be very useful practice.

It would have been well, indeed, if the troops had always found victuals to cook; but here we have the old story again, though the fault is not ascribed exclusively to the Control Department.

To begin with, the Transport Service was insufficient for the occasion.

Two Divisions of 6,000 men each, were to take part in the Manœuvres, but only one of these, according to the original plan, was to be movable.

The Transport Service, therefore, was calculated for the wants of 3,000 men only at a time; and if the first design had been adhered to, the arrangements might have sufficed.

It was afterwards, however, determined that both Divisions should be manœuvred together, but the Transport Service, nevertheless, was left on its original footing, and was, of course, found inadequate.

The weather, as it happened, came in aid of the Department, and, by limiting operations, abridged also the work of transport; but even this was not the worst of the business.

The letters of correspondents have placed before the public a state of affairs which may well serve as a warning.

The Army suffers because concord cannot be established between two services, but in war these jealousies might lead to national disaster.

Colonel Fairfax Williamson, who invited people to attend tea-parties at the house of his neighbor, Mr. Rosenbaum, with the view of extorting 50 guineas, was sentenced to 12 months' hard labor.

The German navy list for 1873 has just been published. It shows the composition of the force as it existed on the 1st of July of the present year.

The corps of navy officers consists of one vice-admiral, five rear-admirals, 14 captains, 30 captains of corvettes, 57 captain-lieutenants, 100 lieutenantants, 80 sub-lieutenants (among them Prince Heinrich, second son of the Crown Prince of Germany,) 100 sea-cadets, 56 cadets.

Among the eight ironclad frigates are counted the two—Kaiser and Deutschland—which are being constructed in England.

Then come the corvette Hansa, two ironclad tran sports, one ship of the line, 13 corvettes, four avisos, one yacht, two gunboats of the Albatross class, seven

gunboats of the first and ten of the second class, and two transport steamers, two frigates, and three brigs are enumerated as sailing vessels, and ten steamers and eight sailing vessels as doing harbour service.

In activity are now in the home waters, four corvettes and one cannon boat, commanded, as evolution squadron, by Rear-Admiral Henok, one ship of the line, four cannon boats, two avisos, two brigs, and two transport steamers.

The Mediteranean squadron under Captain Werner comprises the frigate Frederick Karl, the corvette Elizabeth, and the gunboat Delphin.

The corvette Nymphe, commanded by Captain von Blane, is stationed in Eastern Asia, and the gunboat Albatross, commanded by Captain-Lieutenant Stenzel, in South America.

The frigate Niobe, under Captain McOlean, has gone to Madeira.

STATUE TO GEN. BELGRANO.

To-morrow will be a public holiday by order of both the National and Provincial Governments, on occasion of inaugurating the statue in front of the Government house, in Plaza 25 de Mayo, to the distinguished Argentine general who won the battle of Tucuman on Sept. 24th 1812 over the Spanish army commanded by Tristany.

The life and services of Gen. Belgrano, who was the son of an Italian, appeared in our columns last month. The decree of President Sarmiento is as follows—

Government House, Sept. 20th 1873.

Whereas the equestrian statue of General Belgrano, who first used the Argentine colors on a field of battle, is to be uncovered on the 24th inst., anniversary of the Battle of Tucuman it is expedient to perpetuate the glories and traditions of our national flag.

Art. 1st. The President and his Cabinet, accompanied by the Federal Court, the Foreign Ministers, members of Congress, Governor and authorities of Buenos Ayres, and principal civil and military officials invited for the purpose, will meet at 2 p.m., on Wednesday at the Government house to assist at the inauguration at 3 o'clock precisely.

Art. 2nd. The Archbishop and Canons, assisted by the city clergy and religious communities will perform the customary rites.

Art. 3rd. The pupils of the public schools and colleges will, after the prayers, sing the National Anthem.

Art. 4th. The President of the Republic will unveil the statue and deliver the inaugural address, being followed by the Governor and General Mitre.

Art. 5th. When the statue is uncovered the troops will present arms, the students sing the Argentine Hymn, and the battery fire a salute of 101 guns to the national banner.

Art. 6th. At the same moment telegrams will be sent to the various Provinces announcing the auspicious event.

Art. 7th. The President will show the flag used by the Army of the Andes, which is in keeping of the National Government.

Art. 8th. A guard of honor from sunset the previous evening will take turns at the statue, composed of Independence veterans viz—Generals Zapola, Pedernera, Iriarte, Frias, and Vega; Colonels Guido, Espejo, Quesada, Segui, Uribeur and Velaz; Lieut. Cols. Pineda, Rodriguez, Mejoreiros and Obregoso; and Major Pelliza.

Art. 9th. A corps of veteran and invalid soldiers of Independence, under the above officers, will form on a sides of the statue.

Art. 10th. Outside the above will form the schools of military and naval cadets.

Art. 11th. The city garrison will pass in review under the orders of General Nazari, who served in Belgrano's command.

Art. 12th. The Postmaster-general, Don Geraciao Posadas, will act as Master of Ceremonies.

Art. 13th. All houses in the city will be decorated with the Argentine flag, in honor of the day; the local authorities seeing to this part.

Art. 14th. The report of General Henrique Martinez upon the flag of the Army of the Andes will be given to the public.

Art. 15th. The 24th inst. is hereby declared a public holiday.

Art. 16th. The Ministers of Government will see to the fulfillment of these dispositions.
