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THE NATIONAL BANK

The Directors at last see their way through the London fog that so long enveloped them, and before many days will open the doors of an institution that has already had the breezes of prosperity and adversity before fairly launched, but which is destined to play a prominent part in the financial history of the country. While we write advice reaches us from Chile that the National Bank shares of that Republic are at 120 premium, and there is no reason why we should not anticipate as brilliant a quotation some day for the shares of the present establishment. We have seen private bankers amass splendid fortunes in B. Ayres, while joint-stock banks, railways, gas companies &c. are all at remunerative premiums. That this may be the fate of the new National Bank is the wish of everyone, for Banks are the best friends in new countries, and the more the better.

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These circumstances oblige us to

keep lying idle a sum of 2 1/2 million hard dollars already collected, while we have to pay current expenses, salaries &c. to no purpose, unless we make another call. Meantime there is a prompt and easy way of getting over the difficulty. The Nat. Government has 2 millions \$f. in 5 per cent. bonds specially created to make good its subscription to the Bank. Of this amount the Government can at once hand over half-a-million on account, and this will make up the 3 millions we require by law before opening the Bank. "This will be far from causing a loss to the Government, since the amount represented by these bonds at par will earn a good dividend for the National Treasury, while their special object has been to guarantee the Bank's obligations. These bonds, besides what the Government will be required to hand over on account of the 3 calls, equal to 15 per cent. of the capital, will be kept locked up in the Bank and not allowed to swell the actual amount of Government Bonds on the market; moreover, being only 5 per cents we could not sell them, as we take them, at par. "The interest and amortization of these bonds will be met, as prescribed by law, out of the premium of 5 per cent. of the profits which falls to Government, as well as out of the dividends accruing to the shares held by Government. Failing these means, by any eventuality, the Bank binds itself to discharge the interest and amortization out of any funds at its disposal. "As it is all important to open the Nat. Bank at once the Board of Directors hopes Your Excellency will accede to this suggestion. Emilio Castro."

The President's reply

acceding to the above request is as follows:—"B. Ayres, Oct. 17th. "In view of the petition of the Provisional Board of Directors, and as we are anxious to do everything possible to remove the obstacles in the way of speedily opening the Nat. Bank—we grant the above request. "Let orders be given accordingly for the inscription of these funds, and the delivery of the respective bonds to the Chairman of the Provisional Board of Directors, as in articles 3 and 4 of the Bank-charter. Let the Accountant General be notified, and this decree entered on the official register. SARMIENTO. Luis L. Dominguez."

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Paris Letter

Paris Letter. Sept. 1st. Extremes meet; the royalists and the republicans both avow that by waiting a little longer their respective wishes will be realized. The fusion between the heads having been duly celebrated, the united couple are left to themselves, like most married folks generally. The white flag flies at Frohsdorf, the tricolor in France; these are not yet wedded, and the prospect of our waking up some republican royalists, after going to bed republicans, depends upon the blending of colours. All that official zeal can do to make the country honest and moral, that is to say, to say, is being done. But the nation displays no enthusiasm for the proselytizers. The republicans of pure blood continue to remain as quiet as sucking doves, though their provincial journals are struck down, or suspended with a vigor that must make even imperialists blush. There is one little cloud visible on the horizon, and that a 'point noir' by any means, and about the size of a man's hand—the gradual re-entering of M. Thiers into public life. He resolved to fast from politics since his defeat till the invaders had got over their fever. A fortnight more, and the definite liberation of France will be accomplished, Thiers coming on the scene actively, to lead the vanguard of the country, to give it a local habitation and a name, to deliver battle to untold royalists in battle fashion, must have its influence on home politics. The Journal des Debats is as good as Charivari just now; it is considered the first organ in France for sense, and prevoit by its fantastic evolutions. It abuses all parties alike and in due course, and in this it has the merit of always being consistent.
