

REAT EIRE AT DOCKHEAD.—On April 23 a fire broke out at Messrs. Peak, Frean, and Co.'s Biscuit Manufactory, at Dockhead, Bermondsey. The fire, which commenced about two, a.m., spread so rapidly that the efforts of the firemen had to be chiefly directed to preventing the flames from extending to the adjoining premises. Then ighbouring premises, right and loft, and on the opposite side of St. Saviour's Dock, have suffered extensive damage, both from fire and water, whilst the only portiou of Messrs. Peak, Fr. an, and Co.'s establishment saved from destruction is a small detached block and the counting-house and general offices of the firm. There is no clue to the origin of the fire. During the progress of the conflagration fire barges in the dock caught fire and were turned to the water's edge. Mossrs. Peak, Frean, and Co. desire to inform their friends that the usual course of business will not be interfered with. No delay will take place in executing orders, as all work will be done at their spacious premises at Drammond Road, to which their Dockhead workpeeple have been transferred. During the progress of the fire his Royal Highnoss the Prince of Wales, accompanied by the Duke of Sutterland, visited the scene, and watched with great interest the operations of the firemen.
